10	Sec. 112.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Health care practitioner" means an individual
12	issued a license, certificate, registration, title, permit, or
13	other authorization to engage in a health care profession.
14	(2) "Licensing entity" means a department,
15	commission, board, office, authority, or other agency of the state
16	that regulates activities and persons under this title.
17	Sec. 112.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
18	licensing entities and health care practitioners under Subtitles B,
19	C, D, E, F, and K.

21	SUBCHAPTER B. SERVICES PROVIDED TO CHARITIES, FREE HEALTH CARE

23	Sec. 112.051. REDUCED LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR RETIRED
24	HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONERS PERFORMING CHARITY WORK. (a) Each

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licensing entity shall adopt rules providing for reduced fees and 1 2 continuing education requirements for a retired health care practitioner whose only practice is voluntary charity care. 3 4 (b) The licensing entity by rule shall define voluntary 5 charity care. 6 Sec. 112.052. INDIGENT PATIENT CARE. A licensing entity may adopt rules regarding the regulation of health care 7 8 practitioners who provide free health care to indigent patients at health clinics. 9 Sec. 112.053. INSURANCE. A licensing entity may adopt 10 rules regarding insurance requirements for health care 11 12 practitioners who provide voluntary charity care under this 13 subchapter. 14 Sec. 112.054. MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED AREAS. A licensing 15 entity may adopt rules to promote the provision of health care in 16 medically underserved areas. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
