| 9 | following] the election <u>results</u> . The two commissioners who |
| 10 | received the fewest votes serve <u>a term that expires on December 31</u> |
| 11 | of the year in which the election was held [one-year terms]. The |
| 12 | other emergency services commissioners serve [two-year] terms <u>that</u> |
| 13 | expire on December 31 of the year following the election. |
| 14 | SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 775, Health and Safety |
| 15 | Code, is amended by adding Section 775.044 to read as follows: |
| 16 | Sec. 775.044. VACANCY ON BOARD OF DISTRICT LOCATED IN MORE |
| 17 | THAN ONE COUNTY. (a) Not later than the 90th day after a board |
| 18 | vacancy for a district located in more than one county occurs, the |
| 19 | remaining board members shall appoint a person to fill the |
| 20 | unexpired term. |
| 21 | (b) If the board has not filled the vacancy before the 91st |
| 22 | day after the date of the vacancy, the commissioners court of the |
| 23 | county where the previous board member resided shall appoint a |
| 24 | person to fill the vacancy. |

(c) A person appointed under this section must be eligible to serve under Section 775.035.

3 SECTION 3. Section 775.035(g), Health and Safety Code, as 4 amended by this Act, applies only to an initial commissioner 5 elected on or after the effective date of this Act. An initial 6 commissioner elected before the effective date of this Act is 7 governed by the law in effect when the initial commissioner was 8 elected, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
