1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the operation and functions of the Texas Department of
- 3 Housing and Community Affairs.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2306.004, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subdivisions (12-a), (23-a), (28-a), and (35) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (12-a) "Historically underserved urban area" means an
- 9 urban area described by Section 2306.1116.
- 10 (23-a) "Person with a disability" means a person,
- 11 other than a person with a current condition of addiction to
- 12 <u>alcohol, a drug, an illegal substance, or a federally controlled</u>
- 13 substance, who:
- 14 (A) is able to participate in substantial gainful
- 15 activity only with the use of auxiliary apparatus, by reason of a
- 16 medically determinable physical or mental impairment:
- 17 (i) that has lasted or can be expected to
- 18 last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months or that can
- 19 <u>be expected to result in death;</u>
- 20 <u>(ii)</u> that substantially impedes the
- 21 person's ability to live independently; and
- 22 <u>(iii) that is of such a nature that the</u>
- 23 impairment could be improved by more suitable housing conditions;
- 24 or

1	(B) has a severe, chronic disability that:
2	(i) is attributable to a medically
3	determinable mental or physical impairment or a combination of
4	those types of impairments;
5	(ii) is manifested before the person
6	attains age 22;
7	(iii) is likely to continue indefinitely;
8	and
9	(iv) results in substantial functional
10	limitations in three or more of the following areas of major life
11	activity:
12	<pre>(a) self-care;</pre>
13	(b) receptive and expressive
14	language;
15	(c) learning;
16	(d) mobility;
17	(e) self-direction;
18	(f) capacity for independent living;
19	<u>or</u>
20	(g) economic self-sufficiency.
21	(28-a) "Rural area" means an area that is located:
22	(A) outside the boundaries of a primary
23	metropolitan statistical area or a metropolitan statistical area;
24	(B) within the boundaries of a primary
25	metropolitan statistical area or a metropolitan statistical area,
26	if the statistical area has a population of 25,000 or less and does
27	not share a boundary with an urban area; or

- 1 (C) in an area that is eligible for funding by the
- 2 Texas Rural Development Office of the United States Department of
- 3 Agriculture.
- 4 (35) "Urban area" means the area that is located
- 5 within the boundaries of a primary metropolitan statistical area or
- 6 <u>a metropolitan statistical area other than an area described by</u>
- 7 <u>Subdivision (28-a)(B) or (C).</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 2306.093, Government Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 2306.093. HOUSING ASSISTANCE GOAL. <u>In administering</u>
- 11 the programs under this subchapter, the department [By action of
- 12 the board the community affairs division] shall have a goal to apply
- 13 a minimum of 25 percent of the community affairs division's total
- 14 housing-related funds toward housing assistance for individuals
- 15 and families of very low income.
- SECTION 3. Section 2306.111, Government Code, is amended by
- amending Subsections (b), (c-2), (d), (e), (f), and (i) and adding
- 18 Subsections (c-3) and (d-2) to read as follows:
- 19 (b) The <u>department</u> [housing finance division] shall adopt a
- 20 goal to apply an aggregate minimum of 25 percent of the housing
- 21 <u>finance</u> division's total housing funds toward housing assistance
- for individuals and families of extremely low and very low income if
- 23 <u>it is possible to obtain from other governmental sources the rental</u>
- 24 <u>assistance operating subsidies that are necessary to meet that</u>
- 25 goal.
- 26 (c-2) In allocating set-aside funds under Subsection (c),
- 27 the department may not give preference to nonprofit providers of

1 affordable housing, except as expressly required by federal law.

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(c-3) The department by rule shall set aside five percent of the funds available under <u>Subsection (c) for the benefit of persons</u> with a disability who live in non-participating rural areas that do not qualify to receive funds under the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C. Section 12701 et seq.) directly from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. The department shall annually use \$10 million of the funds available under Subsection (c) for multifamily housing development construction or rehabilitation in an application cycle that is open to all eligible applicants under Section 2306.202. If the department does not receive a sufficient number of financially feasible applications for housing for persons with a disability or for multifamily housing development construction or rehabilitation during the first 120 days of the application cycle, the funds shall be made available for other purposes authorized under the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C. Section 12701 et seq.).

(d) The department shall allocate housing funds provided to the state under the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C. Section 12701 et seq.), housing trust funds administered by the department under Sections 2306.201-2306.206, and commitments issued under the federal low income housing tax credit program administered by the department under Subchapter DD to all <u>urban areas</u>, historically underserved urban [urban/exurban] areas, and rural areas of each uniform state service region based on a formula developed by the department that is based on the need for

housing assistance and the availability of housing resources in 1 2 those <u>urban areas</u>, historically underserved urban [urban/exurban] areas, if applicable, and rural areas, provided that 3 4 allocations are consistent with applicable federal and state 5 requirements and limitations. The department shall use the 6 information contained in its annual state low income housing plan 7 and shall use other appropriate data to develop the formula. 8 purposes of the formula, in determining the availability of housing 9 resources with respect to the department's multifamily housing 10 development construction or rehabilitation programs, the department shall consider the dollar amount of multifamily tax 11 12 exempt bonds, HOME funds used for multifamily housing development construction or rehabilitation, and financing provided by or 13 14 through a local government for construction or rehabilitation of 15 multifamily housing developments that are restricted to individuals and families who earn 60 percent or less of the area 16 17 median income as adjusted for family size. The department may not consider financing involved in the transfer of ownership of an 18 If the department determines under the 19 existing development. formula that an insufficient number of eligible applications for 20 assistance out of funds or credits allocable under this subsection 21 are submitted to the department from a particular uniform state 22 service region, the department shall use the unused funds or 23 24 credits allocated to that region for all urban areas, historically underserved urban [urban/exurban] areas, if applicable, and rural 25 areas in other uniform state service regions based on identified 26 need and financial feasibility. 27

- (d-2) Notwithstanding Subsection (d), if the department 1 2 determines that there is less than \$5 million in housing trust funds available in a calendar year to allocate according to Sections 3 4 2306.201-2306.206, the department shall allocate the housing trust 5 funds among the uniform state service regions without dividing the 6 funds between urban and rural areas. For each uniform state service 7 region, the department must make the first award of funds under this subsection to the applicant with the highest scoring rural 8 9 application.
- 10 (e) The department shall include in its annual low income 11 housing plan under Section 2306.0721:
- 12 (1) the formula developed by the department under 13 Subsection (d); and
- (2) the allocation targets established under the formula for the <u>urban areas</u>, <u>historically underserved urban</u>
 [<u>urban/exurban</u>] areas, if applicable, and rural areas of each uniform state service region.

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- (f) The department shall include in its annual low income housing report under Section 2306.072 the amounts of funds and credits allocated to the <u>urban areas</u>, <u>historically underserved urban [urban/exurban]</u> areas, if applicable, and rural areas of each uniform state service region in the preceding year for each federal and state program affected by the requirements of Subsection (d).
- (i) The director shall designate an employee of the department to act as the information officer and as a liaison with the public regarding each application seeking an allocation of housing funds described by this section. The department liaison

- 1 shall provide written notice to the state senator and state
- 2 representative of the district containing the development that is
- 3 the subject of the application. The liaison shall provide to the
- 4 elected state officials during the application process periodic
- 5 status reports containing information relating to department or
- 6 board actions on the application.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 2306.1111(a), Government Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:

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(a) Notwithstanding any other state law and to the extent consistent with federal law, the department shall establish a uniform application and funding cycle for all single-family and multifamily housing programs administered by the department under this chapter, including a uniform application and funding cycle for housing sponsors of multifamily housing developments applying for funding under the housing funds provided to the state under the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C. Section 12701 et seq.), housing trust funds administered by the department under Sections 2306.201-2306.206, and commitments issued under the federal low income housing tax credit program administered by the department under Subchapter DD. If the department does not receive during the uniform application and funding cycle a sufficient number of financially feasible applications for housing funds provided to the state under the

Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (42 U.S.C.

Section 12701 et seq.) or housing trust funds administered by the

department under Sections 2306.201-2306.206, the department shall

consider additional applications. During the first 120 days of an

1	application and funding cycle for housing funds provided to the
2	state under the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act
3	(42 U.S.C. Section 12701 et seq.) or housing trust funds
4	administered by the department under Sections 2306.201-2306.206,
5	the department may not consider applications requesting a grant of
6	funds.
7	SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 2306, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 2306.1116 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 2306.1116. HISTORICALLY UNDERSERVED URBAN AREAS. (a)
10	In this subchapter, a historically underserved urban area is a
11	<pre>community that:</pre>
12	(1) in uniform state service region three:
13	(A) is located in Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis,
14	Hood, Hunt, Kaufman, Johnson, Parker, Rockwall, or Tarrant County;
15	(B) is not located within the municipal
16	boundaries of Arlington, Dallas, or Fort Worth; and
17	(C) does not meet the definition of a rural area;
18	(2) in uniform state service region six:
19	(A) is located in Chambers, Fort Bend, Harris,
20	Liberty, Montgomery, or Waller County;
21	(B) is not located within the municipal
22	boundaries of Houston; and
23	(C) does not meet the definition of a rural area;
24	(3) in uniform state service region seven:
25	(A) is located in Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays,
26	Travis, or Williamson County;
27	(B) is not located within the municipal

1	boundaries of Austin; and
2	(C) does not meet the definition of a rural area;
3	<u>or</u>
4	(4) in uniform state service region nine:
5	(A) is located in Atascosa, Bexar, Comal,
6	Guadalupe, or Wilson County;
7	(B) is not located within the municipal
8	boundaries of San Antonio; and
9	(C) does not meet the definition of a rural area.
10	(b) The identification of the counties described by
11	Subsection (a) shall be periodically adjusted as necessary to
12	conform with the definition or identification of metropolitan
13	statistical areas for uniform state service regions three, six,
14	seven, and nine.
15	(c) In administering the federal low income housing tax
16	credit program, the department shall further subdivide the urban
17	allocation in any uniform state service region containing a
18	historically underserved urban area, based on the ratio in
19	population between the total number of historically underserved
20	urban areas within an urban area and the population of the urban
21	area as a whole.
22	(d) Notwithstanding this section and Section 2306.111,
23	before the application of the regional allocation formula for
24	calendar years 2006 and 2007, the department shall allocate an
25	additional \$2 million per year to uniform state service region
26	nine, an additional \$1 million per year to uniform state service

region 13, and an additional \$750,000 per year to uniform state

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- 1 service region 11 to alleviate the underfunding for those uniform
- 2 state service regions in prior years.
- 3 (e) The department shall use forward financial commitments
- 4 in 2005 or 2006 to satisfy the provisions of Subsection (d).
- 5 (f) In allocating federal low income housing tax credit
- 6 commitments under Subchapter DD, the department shall use five
- 7 percent of each uniform state service region's allocation to
- 8 developments financed through the Texas Rural Development Office of
- 9 the United States Department of Agriculture that:
- 10 <u>(1) do not exceed 48 units if the development requires</u>
- 11 <u>new construction; or</u>
- 12 (2) are any size if rehabilitation is involved.
- 13 (g) Any funds allocated to developments that satisfy the
- 14 requirements of this section and that involve rehabilitation must
- 15 come from the funds set aside for at-risk developments under
- 16 Section 2306.6714.
- SECTION 6. Section 2306.111(g), Government Code, is
- 18 repealed.
- 19 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act relating to
- 20 the evaluation of applications for financial assistance
- 21 administered by the Texas Department of Housing and Community
- 22 Affairs apply only to an application submitted on or after the
- 23 effective date of this Act. An application submitted before the
- 24 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the
- 25 application was submitted, and the former law is continued in
- 26 effect for that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
