A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the governor's study of emerging technology and
- 3 economic development.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) The office of the governor shall conduct a
- 6 study to:
- 7 (1) review how states and countries with leading
- 8 economies wholly or partly based on information, ideas, and
- 9 technology have structured economic development programs to match
- 10 the needs of businesses in this century;
- 11 (2) identify emerging technologies in this state's
- 12 economy and the growth and development needs of the emerging
- 13 technologies, including need related to existing and potential
- 14 capital resources;
- 15 (3) identify laws and recommend changes in laws which
- 16 have inadvertently or unnecessarily prevented industries,
- 17 businesses, trades or professions from keeping pace with new
- 18 developing or using new capabilities, or from applying existing
- 19 capabilities, including capabilities related to specialized
- 20 technological training.
- 21 (4) summarize and outline all existing tools and
- 22 programs that are available under law to this state and political
- 23 subdivisions of this state for encouraging economic development and
- 24 emerging technology;

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- 1 (5) outline the economic development functions and
- 2 responsibilities of this state, members of the finance community,
- 3 university and industry researchers, and others who have an
- 4 interest in encouraging economic growth and opportunity in this
- 5 state; and
- 6 (6) develop and recommend pilot programs to implement
- 7 and test study recommendations.
- 8 (b) The governor shall report the results of the study
- 9 conducted under Subsection (a), together with recommendations for
- 10 statutory changes, to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the
- 11 house of representatives, and the members of the 80th Legislature
- 12 not later than December 1, 2006.
- SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2007.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
