A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the overtime compensation of employees of the Texas
- 3 Youth Commission.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 659.015, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (c) and (g) and adding Subsection (i) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (i), an [An] employee
- 9 who is required to work hours in excess of 40 hours in a workweek is
- 10 entitled to compensation for the excess hours either by:
- 11 (1) the agency allowing or requiring the employee to
- 12 take compensatory time off at the rate of 1-1/2 hours off for each
- 13 hour of overtime; or
- 14 (2) at the discretion of the employing agency, in
- 15 cases in which granting compensatory time off is impractical, the
- 16 employee receiving pay for the overtime at the rate equal to 1-1/2
- 17 times the employee's regular rate of pay.
- 18 (g) Compensatory time off to which an employee is entitled
- 19 under Subsection (f) must be taken during the 12-month period
- 20 following the end of the workweek in which the compensatory time was
- 21 accrued or it lapses. An employee may not be paid for that
- 22 compensatory time, except that:
- (1) compensatory time of an employee of the Texas
- 24 Youth Commission is not subject to a lapse under this subsection and

- 1 the employee shall be paid for all compensatory time the employee
- 2 has accumulated up to the employee's separation from employment
- 3 with the commission in accordance with Subsection (i)(3); and
- 4 (2) [. However,] an employee of an institution of
- 5 higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, or
- 6 an employee engaged in a public safety activity, including highway
- 7 construction and maintenance or an emergency response activity, may
- 8 be paid at the employee's regular rate of pay for that compensatory
 - time if the employer determines that taking the compensatory time
- 10 off would disrupt normal teaching, research, or other critical
- 11 functions.

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- (i) Subsection (e) does not apply to an employee of the
- 13 Texas Youth Commission. For each hour of compensatory time off to
- 14 which the employee is otherwise entitled under Subsection (f), an
- employee of the Texas Youth Commission:
- 16 (1) is entitled to compensatory time off at the rate of
- 17 1-1/2 hours not to exceed a total of five hours in a week;
- 18 (2) in addition to the compensatory time off to which
- 19 the employee is entitled under Subdivision (1), is entitled to pay
- 20 in the employee's regular paycheck at the rate of 1-1/2 times the
- 21 employee's regular rate of pay for any overtime over five hours in a
- 22 week; and
- 23 (3) at the time of the employee's separation from
- 24 employment with the Texas Youth Commission, shall be paid by the
- 25 commission at the employee's regular rate of pay for any
- 26 compensatory time accumulated under Subdivision (1).
- SECTION 2. Sections 659.015(i)(1) and (2), Government Code,

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- 1 as added by this Act, apply only to overtime hours worked by an
- 2 employee of the Texas Youth Commission on or after the effective
- 3 date of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
