4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 822.001, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 822.001. DEFINITIONS. In this Subchapter:
8	(1) "Animal control authority" means a municipal or
9	county animal control office with authority over the area in which
10	the dog is kept or the county sheriff in an area that does not have
11	an animal control office.
12	(2) "Owner" means a person who owns or has custody or
13	control of the dog.
14	(3) "Secure enclosure" means a fenced area or
15	structure that is:
16	(A) locked;
17	(B) capable of preventing the entry of the
18	general public, including children;
19	(C) capable of preventing the escape or release
20	of the dog placed in the enclosure;
21	(D) clearly marked on all entrances as containing
22	a dog; and
23	(E) in conformance with the requirements, if any,
24	for enclosures established by the local animal control authority.

(4) [(2)] "Serious bodily injury" means an injury 1 characterized by severe bite wounds or severe ripping and tearing 2 of muscle that would cause a reasonably prudent person to seek 3 immediate treatment from a medical professional and that could 4 5 [would] require hospitalization without regard to whether the 6 person actually sought medical treatment. (5) "Unprovoked attack" is an attack by a dog on a 7 8 person in a place other than the secure enclosure in which the dog 9 was being kept. SECTION 2. Subsections (e) and (f), Section 822.003, Health 10 and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows: 11 12 (e) The court shall, except as set out in Subsection (f), [may] order the dog destroyed if the court finds that the dog caused 13 14 serious bodily injury to a person by attacking, biting, or mauling 15 the person. If that finding is not made, the court shall order the dog released to: 16 17 (1) its owner; the person from whom the dog was seized; or 18 (2) 19 (3) any other person authorized to take possession of the dog. 20 The court may not order the dog destroyed if the court 21 (f) finds that the dog caused the serious bodily injury to a person by 22 attacking, biting, or mauling the person and: 23 24 (1)[the dog was being used for the protection of a 25 person or person's property,] the attack, bite, or mauling occurred 26 in the secure [an] enclosure in which the dog was being kept, and [+ (A) the enclosure was reasonably certain to 27

1	prevent the dog from leaving the enclosure on its own and provided
2	notice of the presence of a dog; and
3	(B) the injured person [was at least eight years
4	of age, and] was trespassing in the enclosure when the attack, bite,
5	or mauling occurred;
6	(2) [the dog was not being used for the protection of a
7	person or person's property, the attack, bite, or mauling occurred
8	in an enclosure in which the dog was being kept, and the injured
9	person was at least eight years of age and was trespassing in the
10	enclosure when the attack, bite, or mauling occurred;
11	(3)] the attack, bite, or mauling occurred during an
12	arrest or other action of a peace officer while the peace officer
13	was using the dog for law enforcement purposes; or
14	(3) [(4)] the dog was defending a person from an
15	assault or person's property from damage or theft by the injured
16	person[; or
17	(5) the injured person was younger than eight years of
18	age, the attack, bite, or mauling occurred in the secure [an]
19	enclosure in which the dog was being kept, and the enclosure was
20	reasonably certain to keep a person younger than eight years of age
21	from entering].
22	SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 822, Health and Safety
23	Code, is amended by adding Section 822.006 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 822.006. DEFENDING AGAINST AN UNPROVOKED ATTACK BY A
25	DOG. (a) A person may use any and all means available to defend
26	against an unprovoked attack by a dog on that person or another
27	person, including but not limited to inanimate objects, chemical or

1	other sprays, and electrical shock or stun devices.
2	(b) A person defending against an unprovoked attack by a dog
3	on that person or another person shall not be liable, in law or
4	equity, to the owner of the dog for damages to the dog or to the
5	owner's property. To the extent a person defending against an
6	unprovoked attack by a dog causes damage to the property of persons
7	other than the owner, then the owner of the dog shall be liable for
8	all such damages.
9	(c) The owner of the dog shall be liable for all damages to
10	any person or property resulting from an unprovoked attack by the
11	<u>dog.</u>
12	(d) A person defending against an unprovoked attack by a dog
13	on that person or another person shall not be subject to criminal
14	prosecution for injury to the dog.
15	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
16	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
17	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
18	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
19	Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
