H.B. No. 2859

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to student codes of conduct and school discipline. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 37.001, Education Code, is amended by 4 5 adding Subsections (b) and (e) and amending Subsection (d) to read 6 as follows: (b) The commissioner by rule shall adopt standards for 7 student conduct and enforcement of student codes of conduct, 8 including standards related to due process. A school district's 9 student code of conduct and enforcement of the code of conduct must 10 11 conform to standards adopted under this subsection. 12 (d) Each school year, a school district shall: 13 (1) provide parents notice of and information 14 regarding the student code of conduct; 15 (2) require parents and students to review the code of conduct during a meeting conducted by a school representative; and 16 (3) require that parents and students sign an 17 18 agreement of understanding after the code of conduct and its consequences have been reviewed in a meeting under Subdivision (2). 19 (e) Each campus in a school district shall review the 20 21 student code of conduct with campus administrators and teachers at 22 a meeting held before the first day of instruction each school year. The review may not be considered required staff development for 23 24 purposes of Section 21.451.

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SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
amended by adding Section 37.0051 to read as follows:
<u>Sec. 37.0051. CAMPUS COMMUNITY SERVICE. (a) Before</u>
<u>suspending a student or assigning a student to detention for</u>
<u>engaging in disruptive behavior, other than behavior described by</u>

Section 37.006 or 37.007, the principal or other appropriate
administrator shall consider assigning the student to campus
community service as provided by this section.

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(b) A student assigned to campus community service must:

10 <u>(1) perform the service under the supervision of a</u> 11 <u>teacher other than the teacher of a class in which the student is</u> 12 <u>enrolled, during the teacher's conference period or other time</u> 13 <u>period convenient for the teacher; and</u>

14 (2) perform campus community service duties as 15 required by the teacher and approved by the principal or other 16 appropriate administrator.

17 (c) If a student fails to complete a campus community 18 service assignment, the campus may suspend the student, require a 19 meeting between the student and a campus administrator, or 20 otherwise appropriately discipline the student.

21 <u>(d) The commissioner by rule may determine activities and</u> 22 <u>tasks that are not appropriate for campus community service</u> 23 <u>assignments.</u>

24 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006 25 school year.

26 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
