Chapter 160, Local Government Code, is amended 10 11 by designating Sections 160.001 through 160.007 as Subchapter A and 12 adding a heading for Subchapter A to read as follows: 13 SUBCHAPTER A. GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE FOR COUNTY EMPLOYEES 14 SECTION 3. Chapter 160, Local Government Code, is amended by adding Subchapter B to read as follows: 15 SUBCHAPTER B. TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION OF 16 DEPUTY CONSTABLES 17 18 Sec. 160.051. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "termination 19 or suspension" means: 20 (1) the revocation of a deputy constable's 21 appointment; or (2) the temporary, indefinite, or permanent 22 23 suspension from duty of a deputy constable. Sec. 160.052. TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION. (a) A deputy 24

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1	constable may not be suspended or terminated except for just cause.
2	(b) A deputy constable shall be notified, in writing, of the
3	termination or suspension. The notification must identify the
4	reasons for the termination or suspension.
5	(c) A deputy constable, other than the rank of lieutenant
6	and above, may not be terminated or suspended because of:
7	(1) the election or appointment of a new constable;
8	(2) the expiration of a constable's term of office; or
9	(3) the death of a constable.
10	Sec. 160.053. COUNTIES AND DEPUTY CONSTABLES AFFECTED.
11	This subchapter applies only to a county with a population of more
12	than three million.
13	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
