	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to public education.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 42, Education Code, is amended as
5	follows:
6	Sec. 42.001. STATE POLICY. (a) It is the policy of this
7	state that the provision of public education is a state
8	responsibility and that a thorough and efficient system be provided
9	and financed through state and local revenue sources.
10	(b) In providing revenue to ensure that each student
11	enrolled in the public school system has access to appropriate
12	programs and services required by this section, the public school
13	finance system of this state shall adhere to a standard of
14	neutrality that provides for substantially equal access to similar
15	revenue per student at similar tax effort, considering all state
16	and local tax revenues of districts after acknowledging all
17	legitimate student and district cost differences. This subsection
18	may not be construed as prohibiting a school district from
19	providing enhanced educational programs and services using local
20	revenue.
21	(c) For purposes of fulfilling the state's responsibility
22	for the provision of public education under Section 1, Article VII,
23	Texas Constitution:
24	(1) "General diffusion of knowledge" means the result

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1	of an educational system that makes available, free of tuition, the
2	curriculum required by the legislature to persons entitled to
3	attend public school under general law.
4	(2) "Suitable provision for the support and
5	maintenance of an efficient system of public free schools" means
6	that the legislature:
7	(A) ensures that an educational system is
8	available to all school-age residents of Texas;
9	(B) identifies the resources necessary for the
10	delivery of the required curriculum in Section 28.002;
11	(C) ensures that funding is available to provide
12	the resources described by Paragraph (B);
13	(D) ensures that funding described by Paragraph
14	(C) is provided in a manner that affords the greatest possible
15	flexibility to school districts in use of funds; and
16	(E) ensures that funding for instructional
17	materials is provided through the available school fund.
18	(3) "Efficient system of public free schools" means a
19	system in which:
20	(A) accountability provisions, based primarily
21	on performance standards that measure student academic achievement
22	and ensure that funds provided for the required curriculum are used
23	in a manner that meets the performance indicators in Section
24	39.0261 and Section 39.051 in the Education Code; and
25	(B) in addition to the level of revenue required
26	to be raised for suitable provision, school districts are permitted
27	to raise additional local revenue to provide enhanced local

1	educational programs and services, without a requirement that the
2	state ensure that total local funding is substantially equal
3	throughout the state.
4	Sec. 42.002. PURPOSES OF FOUNDATION SCHOOL PROGRAM (a) The
5	purposes of the Foundation School Program set forth in this chapter
6	are to guarantee that each school district in the state has:
7	(1) adequate resources to provide each eligible
8	student an accredited instructional program and facilities
9	suitable to the student's educational needs; and
10	(2) access to substantially equalized financing for an
11	enriched program.
12	(b) The Foundation School Program consists of:
13	(1) two tiers that in combination provide for:
14	(A) financing for all school districts in
15	accordance with Section 42.001; and
16	(B) substantially equal access to funds to
17	provide an enriched program; and
18	(2) a facilities component as provided by Chapter 46.

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
