3	Department of Criminal Justice facilities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 493, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 493.0101 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 493.0101. WATER CONSERVATION SYSTEMS FOR CORRECTIONAL
8	FACILITIES. (a) The department shall contract with a private
9	vendor, at no cost to the state, to install electronic water
10	conservation systems on prison toilets, sinks, and showers.
11	(b) A private vendor contracting with the department under
12	this section must:
13	(1) demonstrate that the electronic water
14	conservation systems used will yield an annual cost savings of at
15	least 50 percent of the amount of current plumbing operation costs;
16	(2) have a minimum of five years of verifiable
17	experience with retrofit installations in correctional facilities;
18	(3) use technological equipment that has a five-year
19	history of use in correctional facilities; and
20	(4) have demonstrable experience with the use and
21	reuse of gray water.
22	(c) A contract between the department and a private vendor
23	under this section must include a provision that will ensure a
24	budget-neutral or positive fiscal impact on the state.

- 1 (d) The department shall contract for the installation of
- 2 the conservation systems in at least 15 correctional facilities
- 3 designated by the department. In designating a correctional
- 4 facility under this subsection, the department shall consider:
- 5 (1) the facility where the greatest amount of savings
- 6 can be achieved;
- 7 (2) the age of the facility; and
- 8 (3) the potential operational and security concerns of
- 9 the facility.
- 10 (e) A private vendor that contracts with the department
- 11 under this section may not receive any remuneration under the
- 12 contract until cost savings to the state have been verified.
- (f) Not later than December 31, 2006, the department shall
- 14 submit a progress report to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of
- 15 the house of representatives, and the Legislative Budget Board.
- 16 The report must include an evaluation of the initial installation
- 17 of the water conservation systems, the effectiveness of the
- 18 technology used, and the amount of cost savings to the state. The
- 19 department may request assistance from the state auditor and the
- 20 Legislative Budget Board with the preparation of the report and the
- 21 <u>calculation of savings.</u>
- SECTION 2. (a) Not later than October 1, 2005, the Texas
- 23 Department of Criminal Justice shall submit a request for proposals
- 24 from private vendors to provide water conservation systems under
- 25 Section 493.0101, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 26 (b) The initial installation of the water conservation
- 27 systems described by Subsection (a) of this section shall begin not

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- 1 later than February 1, 2006, and shall be completed by January 1,
- 2 2008.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
