A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the predicted retirement of and participation in the
3	optional retirement program by certain employees of institutions of
4	higher education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 830, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 830.1015 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 830.1015. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY TO PARTICIPATE FOR
9	CERTAIN EMPLOYEES. (a) An institution of higher education that
10	participates in the optional retirement program may submit a list
11	to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board of employment
12	positions at the institution that:
13	(1) do not otherwise meet established eligibility for
14	participation in the optional retirement program; and
15	(2) the institution proposes to include for
16	eligibility for participation in the program.
17	(b) A list submitted under Subsection (a) must be based or
18	the competitive labor market requirements of the institution of
19	higher education.
20	(c) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may
21	approve for participation in the optional retirement program one or
22	more of the employment positions at an institution of higher
23	education included on a list submitted under Subsection (a). A

person holding an employment position on a list submitted under

- 1 this section is eligible to participate in the optional retirement
- 2 program, in accordance with this section, only if the Texas Higher
- 3 Education Coordinating Board approves in writing that position for
- 4 participation.
- 5 (d) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board by rule
- 6 shall periodically require the institution of higher education to
- 7 reapply for continued approval of each employment position at that
- 8 institution that is approved for participation in the optional
- 9 retirement program under this section.
- 10 (e) If the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 11 terminates the eligibility of an employment position for
- 12 participation in the optional retirement program under Subsection
- 13 (d), an employee hired into the position before the date of the
- 14 termination and participating in the program on that date remains
- in the program, subject to the rules of the retirement system. An
- 16 employee hired into that position after the date of the termination
- 17 shall participate in the retirement system if the employee is
- 18 otherwise eligible.
- 19 (f) Notwithstanding Subchapter C, the state contribution
- 20 for an employee in an employment position that participates in the
- 21 optional retirement program under this section is equal to the
- 22 <u>contribution made for a participant in the retirement system.</u>
- 23 (g) The total employer contribution for an employee in an
- 24 employment position at an institution of higher education that
- 25 participates in the optional retirement program under this section
- 26 is the same as the amount contributed for other employees of the
- 27 institution participating in the program. The institution shall

- 1 contribute an amount equal to the difference between the amount
- 2 contributed under Subsection (f) and the total employer
- 3 contribution required under this subsection. If the institution
- 4 contributes at different rates for different participants, the
- 5 total employer contribution required under this subsection is based
- 6 on the contribution applicable to a new participant at the time
- 7 contributions under the program begin for that participant.
- 8 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 51.4021 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 51.4021. STUDY AND REPORT OF PREDICTED FACULTY
- 11 RETIREMENT. (a) In this section, "general academic teaching
- 12 institution," "governing board," and "university system" have the
- meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
- 14 (b) To address the predicted retirement of a growing portion
- of university faculty in the coming years as a result of aging and
- 16 the potential problems associated with that retirement, each
- 17 general academic teaching institution shall conduct a study
- 18 relating to faculty member retirements that may occur through the
- 19 end of the 2025 academic year, including projections of the number
- 20 and proportion of faculty members expected to retire during that
- 21 period, the first academic year in which increasing retirements are
- 22 expected to result in faculty shortages, and methods that the
- 23 <u>institution could reasonably implement to address those retirement</u>
- 24 issues through recruitment of new faculty members or other means.
- 25 The governing board of an institution may appoint a committee to
- 26 conduct the study. A university system may carry out the
- 27 requirements prescribed by this subsection for the system's

- 1 component institutions or may direct one or more component
- 2 <u>institutions to conduct the study for the system.</u>
- 3 (c) Each general academic teaching institution or
- 4 university system, as applicable, shall prepare a report based on
- 5 the study required by Subsection (b). The institution or system
- 6 shall submit the report to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 7 Board not later than September 1, 2006.
- 8 <u>(d) This section expires January 1, 2007.</u>
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
