- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 25.902 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 25.902. CERTAIN MANDATORY STUDENT IDENTIFICATION
- 8 METHODS PROHIBITED. (a) In this section, "radio frequency
- 9 <u>identification technology" means a wireless identification system</u>
- 10 that uses an electromagnetic radio frequency signal to transmit
- 11 data between a card, badge, or tag and another device without
- 12 physical contact.
- 13 (b) A school district may not require a student to use an
- 14 identification device that uses radio frequency identification
- 15 technology or similar technology to identify the student, transmit
- 16 information regarding the student, or track the location of the
- 17 student.

- 18 (c) A school district that permits the voluntary use of a
- 19 student identification device described by Subsection (b) shall
- 20 provide an alternative method of identification for a student if
- 21 the student's parent or guardian submits timely written objection
- 22 to the use of radio frequency identification technology.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006
- 24 school year.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
