- 5 SECTION 1. Section 659.042, Government Code, is amended to

- 7 Sec. 659.042. EXCLUSIONS. The following are not entitled
- 8 to longevity pay under this subchapter:
- 9 (1) a member of the legislature;
- 10 (2) an individual who holds a statewide office that is
- 11 normally filled by vote of the people;
- 12 (3) an independent contractor or an employee of an
- 13 independent contractor;
- 14 (4) a temporary employee;
- 15 (5) an officer or employee of a public junior college;
- 16 [<del>or</del>]
- 17 (6) an academic employee of a state institution of
- 18 higher education; or
- 19 <u>(7) a state employee who receives an annuity based</u>
- 20 wholly or partly on service as a state officer or state employee in
- 21 <u>a public retirement system, as defined by Section 802.001, that was</u>
- 22 credited to the state employee.
- 23 SECTION 2. Section 659.126, Government Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

(c) An eligible state employee who receives an annuity based wholly or partly on service as a state officer or state employee in a public retirement system, as defined by Section 802.001, that was credited to the state employee is ineligible to receive benefit replacement pay.

- 6 SECTION 3. Section 661.152, Government Code, is amended by 7 adding Subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 8 (1) For purposes of computing vacation leave under
  9 Subsection (d) for a state employee who receives an annuity based
  10 wholly or partly on service as a state officer or state employee in
  11 a public retirement system, as defined by Section 802.001, that was
  12 credited to the state employee, years of total state employment
  13 includes only the length of state employment after the date the
  14 state employee retired.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
