19	Sec. 5.101. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter

21	intended to be used as the purchaser's residence or as the residence

2	Sec. 5.102. PROHIBITED USE OF EXECUTORY CONTRACT FOR
3	CONVEYANCE. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a person may not
4	sell or purchase real property described by Section 5.101 under an
5	executory contract for conveyance.
6	(b) An executory contract for conveyance that purports to
7	convey real property described by Section 5.101 is void and has no
8	effect.
9	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
