## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the amount of the annual constitutional appropriation 3 to certain agencies and institutions of higher education and to the 4 allocation of those funds to those agencies and institutions.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6 SECTION 1. Section 62.021(a), Education Code, is amended to
7 read as follows:

(a) Each fiscal year, an eligible institution is entitled to 8 receive an amount allocated in accordance with this section from 9 appropriated by Section 17(a), Article VII, 10 funds Texas 11 Constitution. The comptroller shall distribute funds allocated 12 under this subsection only on presentation of a claim and issuance of a warrant in accordance with Section 403.071, Government Code. 13 14 The comptroller may not issue a warrant from any funds allocated under this subsection before the delivery of goods or services 15 described in Section 17, Article VII, Texas Constitution, except 16 for the payment of principal or interest on bonds or notes or for a 17 18 payment for a book or other published library material as authorized by Section 2155.386, Government Code. The allocation of 19 funds under this subsection is made in accordance with an equitable 20 21 formula consisting of the following elements: space deficit, 22 facilities condition, institutional complexity, and separate 23 allocations for medical units and the Texas State Technical College System[, and an additional allocation for Texas Southern University 24

No. 3001 [an allocation of] \$5,453,977 to the 1 (D) 2 University of Houston--Downtown; (13) to the [<del>\$12,692,873 The</del>] following component 3 4 institutions [components] of The Texas A&M University System: 5 (A) [, including an allocation of] \$3,687,722 to Texas A&M University--Corpus Christi; 6 7 (B) [an allocation of] \$1,778,155 to Texas A&M 8 International University; (C) [an allocation of] \$3,555,651 to Texas A&M 9 10 University--Kingsville; [and] [an allocation of] \$3,671,345 to West Texas 11 (D) 12 A&M University; 13 (E) \$4,229,747 to Texas A&M 14 University--Commerce; and 15 (F) \$1,027,070 Texas A&M to University--Texarkana; and 16 (14) \$3,850,000 to the Texas State Technical College 17 System Administration and the following component campuses, but not 18 19 its extension centers or programs: (A) Texas State Technical College-Harlingen; 20 21 Texas State Technical College--Marshall; (B) Texas State Technical College-Sweetwater; 22 (C) 23 and 24 (D) Texas State Technical College--Waco. 25 SECTION 2. Section 62.021(e), Education Code, is repealed. SECTION 3. The amounts allocated under Section 62.021, 26 27 Education Code, as amended by this Act, apply to each state fiscal
