Section 711.002(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 (a) Unless a decedent has left directions in writing for the 7 disposition of the decedent's remains as provided in Subsection 8 (g), the following persons, in the priority listed, have the right 9 to control the disposition, including cremation, of the decedent's 10 11 remains, shall inter the remains, and are liable for the reasonable 12 cost of interment: 13 (1) the person designated in a written instrument 14 signed by the decedent; (2) the decedent's surviving spouse; 15 16 (3) any one of the decedent's surviving adult children; 17 [either one of] the decedent's surviving mother 18 (4) and father, other than a person whose parental rights have been 19 terminated [parents]; 20 21 (5) any one of the decedent's surviving adult siblings; or 22 any adult person in the next degree of kinship in 23 (6) the order named by law to inherit the estate of the decedent. 24
