- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 130.0032, Texas Education Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 130.0032. TUITION FOR STUDENTS RESIDING OUTSIDE OF
- 8 DISTRICT. (a) The governing board of a public junior college
- 9 district may allow a person who resides outside the district and who
- 10 owns property subject to ad valorem taxation by the district or a
- 11 dependent of the person, to pay tuition at the rate applicable to a
- 12 student who resides in the district.
- 13 (b) The governing board of a public junior college district
- 14 may allow a person who resides outside the district and in the
- 15 taxing district of a contiguous public junior college district to
- 16 pay tuition and fees at the rate applicable to a student who resides
- 17 in the district.
- 18 (c) The governing board of a public junior college district
- 19 may allow a person who resides outside the district to pay tuition
- 20 and fees at a rate less than the rate applicable to other persons
- 21 residing outside the district, but not less than the rate
- 22 applicable to a student who resides in the district, if the person:
- 23 (1) resides within the service area of the district;

[does not reside in an independent school district (2) 1 2 that meets the criteria of the coordinating board for the establishment of a junior college district under Section 130.013; 3 4 and [(3)] demonstrates financial need in accordance with 5 6 rules adopted by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. 7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 8 to tuition for a semester that begins on or after December 1, 2005. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
