Sections 31.063-31.066, Parks and Wildlife Code, 4 5 are amended to read as follows: Sec. 31.063. CLASSES OF VESSELS 6 [MOTORBOATS]. Vessels [Motorboats] subject to the provisions of this chapter are divided 7 into four classes according to length as follows: 8 Class A. Less than 16 feet in length. 9 Class 1. 16 feet or over and less than 26 feet in length. 10 Class 2. 26 feet or over and less than 40 feet in length. 11 12 Class 3. 40 feet in length or over. 13 Sec. 31.064. LIGHTS. A vessel [or motorboat] when not at dock must have and exhibit at least one bright light, lantern, or 14 flashlight from sunset to sunrise in all weather. A vessel [or 15 motorboat] when underway between sunset and sunrise in all weather 16 must have and exhibit the lights prescribed by federal regulations 17 [the commandant of the Coast Guard] for vessels [boats] of its 18 class. No other lights that may be mistaken for those prescribed 19 20 may be exhibited. 21 Sec. 31.065. SOUND-PRODUCING DEVICES. А vessel 22 [motorboat] must have an efficient whistle or other sound-producing device if one is required by federal regulations [the commandant of 23

Sec. 31.066. LIFE PRESERVING DEVICES. (a) A <u>vessel</u>
 [motorboat] must have at least one life preserver[, life belt, ring
 buoy, or other device] of the sort prescribed by <u>federal</u> [the]
 regulations [of the commandant of the Coast Guard] for each person
 on board, so placed as to be readily accessible.

6 (b) A <u>vessel</u> [motorboat] carrying passengers for hire must 7 have a readily accessible life preserver of the sort prescribed by 8 <u>federal</u> [the] regulations [of the commandant of the Coast Guard] 9 for each person on board.

10 (c) The operator of a class A or class 1 <u>vessel</u> [motorboat], 11 while underway, shall require every passenger under 13 years of 12 age<u>, unless below decks or in an enclosed cabin</u>, to wear a life 13 preserver of the sort prescribed by <u>federal</u> [the] regulations [of 14 the commandant of the Coast Guard. A life belt or ring buoy does not 15 satisfy this requirement].

SECTION 2. Sections 31.106(a) and (d), Parks and Wildlife
Code, are amended to read as follows:

18 (a) No person shall operate a personal watercraft in the19 following manner or under the following circumstances:

(1) unless each person riding on or towed behind the
vessel is wearing a U.S. Coast Guard approved Type I, II, III, or V
personal flotation device;

(2) if the vessel is equipped by the manufacturer with
a lanyard type engine cutoff switch, unless such lanyard is
attached to the person, clothing, or personal flotation device of
the operator as appropriate for the vessel involved;

27 (3) during the period between sunset and sunrise;

(4) within 50 feet of any other vessel, person,
 stationary platform or other object, or shore, except at headway
 speed;

4 (5) [if the operator is under 16 years of age, unless 5 the operator:

6 [(A) is accompanied by a person at least 18 years
7 of age; or

8 [(B) is at least 13 years of age and has 9 successfully completed a boating safety course prescribed and 10 approved by the department;

11 [(6)] if the personal watercraft is a motorboat, 12 within any area prohibited for operation of a motorboat by state law 13 or local rule or regulation;

14 (6) [(7)] while towing water skis, an aquaplane, a 15 surfboard, a tube, or any other similar device, unless the towing 16 vessel is designed to carry on board a minimum of two persons;

17 <u>(7)</u> [(8)] by jumping the wake of another vessel 18 recklessly or unnecessarily close to that vessel; or

(8) [(9)] in a manner that requires the operator to
 swerve at the last possible moment to avoid collision.

(d) An owner of a personal watercraft <u>may not allow</u>
[permitting] a person under 18 years of age to operate the personal
watercraft in a manner prohibited by this section [may be notified
of the violation].

25 SECTION 3. Section 31.108(f), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 26 amended to read as follows:

H.B. No. 3051 SECTION 5. Section 31.110, Parks and Wildlife Code, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 Sec. 31.110. EXEMPTION 3 FROM BOATER EDUCATION COURSE 4 REQUIREMENT. A person is not required to comply with Section 5 31.109 if the person: 6 (1) holds a master's, mate's, or operator's license 7 issued by the United States Coast Guard; 8 (2) is accompanied and supervised by a person who [+ 9 $\left[\frac{(\Lambda)}{(\Lambda)}\right]$ is otherwise exempt from the requirements of Section 31.109 or possesses the documents required under [a 10 boater identification card as required by] Section 31.109[; and 11 [(B) is at least 18 years of age]; 12 (3) [is at least 18 years of age; 13 14 [(4)]is not a resident of this state and has proof 15 that the person has successfully completed a boater education course or equivalency examination in another state that is approved 16 17 by the department; or (4) [(5)] is exempt by rule of the department. 18 SECTION 6. Sections 31.107, 31.108(c), and 31.131(b), Parks 19 and Wildlife Code, are repealed. 20 SECTION 7. Section 31.108(f), Parks and Wildlife Code, as 21 amended by this Act, applies only to a course or examination held on 22 or after September 1, 2005. For purposes of this section, a course 23 24 or examination is held before September 1, 2005, if any part of the 25 course or examination is held before that date. A course or examination held before September 1, 2005, is governed by the law as 26 it existed on the date the course or examination was held, and that 27

2	SECTION 8.	This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
