### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT relating to a risk assessment program for Type 2 diabetes and the creation of the Type 2 Diabetes Risk Assessment Program Advisory Committee. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 95, Health and Safety 7 Code, as added by Chapter 1465, Acts of the 77th Legislature, 8 Regular Session, 2001, is amended to read as follows:

9 CHAPTER 95. <u>RISK ASSESSMENT FOR TYPE 2 DIABETES</u>

## [ACANTHOSIS NIGRICANS SCREENING]

11 SECTION 2. Section 95.001(2), Health and Safety Code, as 12 added by Chapter 1465, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular 13 Session, 2001, is amended to read as follows:

14 (2) <u>"Department" means the Department of State Health</u>
 15 <u>Services</u> ["Executive council" means the executive council advising
 16 the Texas-Mexico Border Health Coordination Office of The
 17 University of Texas-Pan American].

SECTION 3. Sections 95.002, 95.003, and 95.004, Health and Safety Code, as added by Chapter 1465, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, are amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 95.002. <u>TYPE 2 DIABETES</u> [ACANTHOSIS NIGRICANS] 22 EDUCATION AND <u>RISK ASSESSMENT PROGRAM</u> [SCREENING PROJECT]. 23 (a) The <u>department</u> [office] shall administer <u>a risk assessment</u> 24 <u>program for Type 2 diabetes</u> [an acanthosis nigricans screening

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program] in accordance with this chapter. To administer the risk 1 2 assessment program, the department may contract with one or more institutions of higher education, such as the Texas-Mexico Border 3 4 Health Coordination Office of The University of Texas--Pan American 5 or the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, and may assign 6 to an institution under a contract any duty required by this 7 chapter. 8 (b) The department [executive council by rule] shall coordinate the risk assessment for Type 2 diabetes [screening] of 9 individuals who attend public or private schools located in Texas 10 Education Agency Regional Education Service Centers 1, 2, 3, 4, 10, 11 11, 13, 15, 18, 19, and 20 and in additional regional education 12 service centers as funding is available. 13 The <u>department shall establish the</u> [rules must include] 14 (c) 15 procedures necessary to administer the risk assessment program, including procedures that require each school to record and report 16 17 risk assessment [screening] activities using: (1) the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's 18 Epi Info or similar surveillance software selected by the 19 20 department; or 21 (2) an existing database used to administer and track 22 risk assessment data. The department [office] shall require a risk assessment 23 (d) 24 for Type 2 diabetes [acanthosis nigricans screening] to be performed at the same time hearing and vision screening is 25 performed under Chapter 36 or spinal screening is performed under 26 Chapter 37. The risk assessment for Type 2 diabetes should: 27

No. 3099 (1) identify students with a body mass index above the 1 2 normal range; and 3 (2) further assess students identified under Subdivision (1) for acanthosis nigricans and elevated blood 4 5 pressure. 6 (e) The department [office] may: (1) coordinate the risk assessment for Type 2 diabetes 7 [acanthosis nigricans screening] activities of school districts, 8 9 private schools, state agencies, volunteer organizations, universities, and other entities so that the efforts of each entity 10 are complementary and not fragmented and duplicative; and 11 (2) [. The office may] provide technical assistance 12 to those entities in developing risk assessment [screening] 13 14 programs. 15 (f) The department shall: (1) [and may] provide educational and other material 16 17 to assist local risk assessment [screening] activities; (2) [. (f) The office shall] monitor the quality of 18 19 risk assessment [screening] activities provided under this 20 chapter; and (3) consult with the Board of Nurse Examiners to 21 determine the training requirements necessary for a nurse or other 22 person to conduct risk assessment activities under this chapter. 23 24 (g) The department shall periodically provide information on obesity, Type 2 diabetes, and related conditions to physicians. 25 Sec. 95.003. COMPLIANCE WITH RISK ASSESSMENT [SCREENING] 26 REQUIREMENTS. (a) Each individual required by rules adopted under 27

this chapter to be <u>assessed</u> [screened] shall undergo approved <u>risk</u> 1 2 assessment [screening] for Type 2 diabetes [acanthosis nigricans]. The individual shall comply with the requirements as soon as 3 possible after the individual's admission to a school and as 4 required by rule. The individual or, if the individual is a minor, 5 6 the minor's parent, managing conservator, or guardian may 7 substitute a professional examination for the risk assessment 8 [screening].

9 (b) An individual is exempt from risk assessment 10 [screening] if <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] conflicts with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or religious 11 denomination of which the individual is an adherent or a member. To 12 qualify for the exemption, the individual or, if the individual is a 13 14 minor, the individual's parent, managing conservator, or guardian 15 must submit to the chief administrator of the school on or before the day of the <u>risk assessment process</u> [screening procedure] an 16 17 affidavit stating the objections to the risk assessment [screening]. 18

(c) The chief administrator of each school shall ensure that
 each individual admitted to the school complies with the <u>risk</u>
 <u>assessment</u> [screening] requirements set by the <u>department</u>
 [executive council] or submits an affidavit of exemption.

23 Sec. 95.004. RECORDS; REPORTS. (a) The chief 24 administrator of each school shall maintain, on a form prescribed 25 by the <u>department, risk assessment</u> [executive council, screening] 26 records for each individual in attendance[-] and <u>enter the risk</u> 27 assessment information for each individual on the Centers for

Disease Control and Prevention's Epi Info or similar surveillance software selected by the department. The risk assessment [the] records are open for inspection by the <u>department</u> [office] or the local health department.

5 (b) The <u>department</u> [office] may, directly or through local 6 health departments, enter a school and inspect records maintained 7 by the school relating to <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] for <u>Type 2</u> 8 diabetes [acanthosis nigricans].

9 (c) An individual's <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] records may 10 be transferred among schools without the consent of the individual 11 or, if the individual is a minor, the minor's parent, managing 12 conservator, or guardian.

(d) The person performing the <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] shall send a report indicating that an individual may <u>be at risk for</u> <u>developing Type 2 diabetes</u> [have acanthosis nigricans] to the individual or, if the individual is a minor, the minor's parent, managing conservator, or guardian. The report must include:

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(1) an explanation of<u>:</u>

19 (A) the process for assessing risk for developing
20 Type 2 diabetes;
21 (B) the body mass index;

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# (C) the risk factors associated with developing Type 2 diabetes; and

24 (D) the reasons the individual was identified in 25 the risk assessment process as being at risk for developing Type 2 26 diabetes [acanthosis nigricans and related conditions];

27 (2) a statement concerning an individual's or family's

1 need for further evaluation <u>for Type 2 diabetes and related</u> [<del>of</del>]
2 conditions [<del>related to acanthosis nigricans</del>]; and

3 (3) instructions to help the individual or family 4 receive evaluation <u>by a physician or health care provider</u> [<del>and</del> 5 <u>intervention by the school district</u>].

6 (e) Each school shall submit to the <u>department</u> [office] an 7 annual report on the <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] status of the 8 individuals in attendance during the reporting year and shall 9 include in the report any other information required by the 10 <u>department</u> [office].

11 (f) The <u>annual report required under Subsection (e)</u> must be 12 <u>compiled from the information entered into the surveillance</u> 13 <u>software and be</u> on a form prescribed by the <u>department</u> [<del>executive</del> 14 <del>council and must be submitted according to the executive council's</del> 15 <del>rules</del>].

16 (g) The department shall analyze and compile a summary of 17 the reports submitted by schools under Subsection (e) and make the 18 summary available to schools and the public on request.

19 (h) [(f)] Not later than January 15 of each odd-numbered 20 year, the <u>department</u> [office] shall submit to the governor and the 21 legislature a report concerning the effectiveness of the <u>risk</u> 22 <u>assessment program for Type 2 diabetes</u> [acanthosis nigricans 23 <u>screening program</u>] established by this chapter.

SECTION 4. Chapter 95, Health and Safety Code, as added by Chapter 1465, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is amended by adding Section 95.005 to read as follows:

Section 1751 et seq.; 7 (4) recommend a timeline for the department to 8 implement the advisory committee's recommended risk assessment 9 10 activities, surveillance methods, reports, and quality 11 improvements; and 12 (5) contribute to the state plan for diabetes treatment developed by the council under Section 103.013 by 13 providing statistics and information on the risk assessment 14 15 activities conducted under Chapter 95 and recommendations for assisting children in this state at risk for developing Type 2 16 17 diabetes. SECTION 6. (a) As early as possible after the effective 18 date of this Act, the executive head of the following entities shall 19 appoint a representative to serve on the Type 2 Diabetes Risk 20 Assessment Program Advisory Committee created under Section 21 103.0125, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act: 22 (1) the Texas Diabetes Council; 23 24 (2) the Department of State Health Services; 25 the Texas Education Agency; (3) 26 (4) the Texas Medical Association; 27 (5) the Texas Pediatric Society;

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(6) the American Heart Association;

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(7) the American Diabetes Association;

3 (8) the institution of higher education involved in
4 Type 2 diabetes research selected by the Texas Diabetes Council for
5 this purpose; and

6 (9) the schools and school district selected by the
7 Texas Diabetes Council for this purpose.

8 (b) As early as possible after the effective date of this 9 Act, the Texas School Nurses Organization and the Texas School 10 Nurse Administrators Association shall jointly select a nurse 11 representative from a rural school and a nurse representative from 12 an urban school to serve on the Type 2 Diabetes Risk Assessment 13 Program Advisory Committee created under Section 103.0125, Health 14 and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

(c) As early as possible after the effective date of this Act, the head of the Texas Diabetes Council shall appoint a parent or guardian of a child in this state with Type 2 diabetes to serve on the Type 2 Diabetes Risk Assessment Program Advisory Committee created under Section 103.0125, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

21 SECTION 7. Subdivisions (3) and (6), Section 95.001, Health 22 and Safety Code, as added by Chapter 1465, Acts of the 77th 23 Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, are repealed.

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SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
