3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 2059 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 2059. TEXAS COMPUTER NETWORK SECURITY SYSTEM
7	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
8	Sec. 2059.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Center" means the network security center
10	established under this chapter.
11	(2) "Department" means the Department of Information
12	Resources.
13	(3) "Network security" means the protection of
14	computer systems and technology assets from unauthorized external
15	intervention or improper use. The term includes detecting,
16	identifying, and countering malicious network activity to prevent
17	the acquisition of information or disruption of information
18	technology operations.
19	(4) "State agency" has the meaning assigned by Section
20	<u>2151.002.</u>
21	[Sections 2059.002-2059.050 reserved for expansion]
22	SUBCHAPTER B. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES
23	Sec. 2059.051. DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING
24	COMPUTER NETWORK SECURITY SERVICES. The department shall provide

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1	network security services to:
2	(1) state agencies; and
3	(2) other entities by agreement as provided by Section
4	2059.057.
5	Sec. 2059.052. RULES. The department may adopt rules
6	necessary to implement this chapter.
7	Sec. 2059.053. OWNERSHIP OR LEASE OF NECESSARY EQUIPMENT.
8	The department may purchase in accordance with Chapters 2155, 2156,
9	2157, and 2158 any facilities or equipment necessary to provide
10	network security services to state agencies.
11	Sec. 2059.054. RESTRICTED INFORMATION. Specific network
12	security information about a state agency may be released only to
13	officials responsible for the network, law enforcement, and
14	designated agency or elected officials.
15	Sec. 2059.055. RESPONSIBILITY FOR EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL
16	SECURITY THREATS. If the department provides network security
17	services for a state agency or other entity under this chapter, the
18	department is responsible for network security from external
19	threats for that agency or entity. Network security management for
20	that state agency or entity regarding internal threats remains the
21	responsibility of that state agency or entity.
22	Sec. 2059.056. BIENNIAL REPORT. The department shall
23	biennially submit a report to the legislature on:
24	(1) the department's accomplishment of service
25	objectives and other performance measures under this chapter; and
26	(2) the status, including the financial performance,
27	of the consolidated network security system provided through the

1 center. 2 Sec. 2059.057. AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE NETWORK SECURITY SERVICES TO ENTITIES OTHER THAN STATE AGENCIES. (a) In this 3 4 section, a "special district" means: 5 (1) a school district; 6 (2) a hospital district; 7 (3) a water district; or (4) a district or special water authority, as defined 8 by Section 49.001, Water Code. 9 (b) In addition to the department's duty to provide network 10 security services to state agencies under this chapter, the 11 12 department by agreement may provide network security to: (1) each house of the legislature; 13 14 (2) an agency that is not a state agency, including a 15 legislative agency; 16 (3) a political subdivision of this state, including a 17 county, municipality, or special district; and (4) an independent organization, as defined by Section 18 39.151, Utilities Code. 19 Sec. 2059.058. TRANSITION TO THE CENTER. (a) 20 The 21 department shall provide network security services for a state 22 agency if the department makes that state agency's network a part of the consolidated state network through the center. 23 24 (b) Before the construction and operation of the center, the department may provide network security services through 25 26 agreements with entities that provide those services using existing 27 network security centers or operations.

No. 3112 (c) If the state agency or entity pays its proportional 1 2 share of the network security services costs under this chapter, the department shall provide network security services to that 3 4 state agency or other entity before the department makes the state 5 agency's network a part of the consolidated state network. 6 (d) This section expires September 1, 2011. [Sections 2059.059-2059.100 reserved for expansion] 7 SUBCHAPTER C. NETWORK SECURITY CENTER 8 Sec. 2059.101. NETWORK SECURITY CENTER. The department 9 shall establish a network security center to provide network 10 security services to state agencies. 11 Sec. 2059.102. MANAGEMENT AND USE OF NETWORK SECURITY 12 SYSTEM. (a) The department shall manage the operation of network 13 14 security system services for all state agencies at the center. 15 (b) The department shall fulfill the network security 16 requirements of each state agency to the extent practicable. 17 (c) All state agencies shall use the network security services provided through the center to the fullest extent 18 19 possible. (d) A state agency may not purchase network security 20 21 services unless the department determines that the agency's 22 requirement for network security services cannot be met at a comparable cost through the center. The department shall develop 23 24 an efficient process for this determination. 25 Sec. 2059.103. CENTER LOCATION AND PHYSICAL SECURITY. (a) 26 The department shall locate the center at a location that has an existing secure and restricted facility, cyber-security 27

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1	infrastructure, available trained workforce, and supportive
2	educational capabilities.
3	(b) The department shall control and monitor all entrances
4	and critical areas to prevent unauthorized entry. The department
5	shall limit access to authorized individuals.
6	(c) Local law enforcement or security agencies shall
7	monitor security alarms at the center according to service
8	availability.
9	(d) The department shall restrict operational information
10	to personnel at the center.
11	Sec. 2059.104. CENTER SERVICES AND SUPPORT. (a) The
12	department shall provide the following managed security services
13	through the center:
14	(1) real-time network security monitoring to detect
15	and respond to network security events that may jeopardize this
16	state and the residents of this state, including vulnerability
17	assessment services consisting of a comprehensive security posture
18	assessment, external and internal threat analysis, and penetration
19	testing;
20	(2) continuous, 24-hour alerts and guidance for
21	defeating network security threats, including firewall
22	pre-configuration, installation, management and monitoring,
23	intelligence gathering, protocol analysis, and user
24	authentication;
25	(3) immediate incident response to counter network
26	security activity that exposes this state and the residents of this
27	state to risk, including complete intrusion detection systems

No. 3112 1 installation, management and monitoring, and a network operations 2 call center; 3 (4) development, coordination, and execution of 4 statewide cyber-security operations to isolate, contain, and mitigate the impact of network security incidents at state 5 6 agencies, including the engineering, monitoring, and management of 7 a secure, virtual private network for the applicable agencies and 8 constituents; (5) implementation of best-of-breed information 9 security architecture engineering services, including public key 10 infrastructure development, design, engineering, custom software 11 12 development, and secure web design; (6) operation of a central authority for all statewide 13 14 information assurance programs; 15 (7) certification and accreditation to ensure compliance with the applicable regulatory requirements for 16 17 cyber-security and information technology risk management, including the use of proprietary tools to automate the assessment 18 19 and enforcement of compliance; and (8) the provision of educational services regarding 20 21 network security through the maintenance and operation of a fully staffed and equipped training facility. 22 (b) The department shall provide state agency network 23 24 security managers the following support through the center: (1) real-time information about network security 25 26 events involving networks under the managers' supervision; 27 (2) help desk support seven days a week and 24 hours a

2	(3) incident history, including intrusions, attempted
3	intrusions, denials of service, viral infections, and probing;
4	(4) incident and event chronologies and response time
5	<u>lines;</u>
6	(5) a central incident response team capability;
7	(6) sensor and firewall performance management;
8	(7) recommended actions and training for mitigating
9	incidents;
10	(8) the ability to detect, contain, eradicate, and
11	report network security incidents to minimize the effect on the
12	confidentiality, availability, and integrity of state services and
13	corresponding forensic support; and
14	(9) the capability to promptly respond to incidents in
15	accordance with predetermined escalation procedures, including the
16	prioritization of cyber-security threats, impacts, and established
17	required responses and time lines for the responses.
18	Sec. 2059.105. NETWORK SECURITY GUIDELINES AND STANDARD
19	OPERATING PROCEDURES. (a) The department shall adopt and provide
20	to all state agencies appropriate network security guidelines and
21	standard operating procedures to ensure efficient operation of the
22	center with a maximum return on investment for the state.
23	(b) The department shall revise the standard operating
24	procedures as necessary to confirm network security.
25	(c) Each state agency shall comply with the network security
26	policies, guidelines, and standard operating procedures.
27	Sec. 2059.106. PRIVATE VENDOR. (a) The department may

No. 3112 contract with a private vendor to build and operate the center and 1 2 act as an authorized agent to acquire, install, integrate, maintain, configure, and monitor the network security services and 3 4 security infrastructure elements. 5 (b) A private vendor contracted with under this section 6 must: (1) have the professional experience and the proven 7 8 ability to establish and maintain a security operations center, 9 including the necessary standard operating procedures and the aptitude to specifically provide the services and capabilities 10 described by this chapter; 11 12 (2) have the verified capability to lead and partner with other vendors through joint ventures or other arrangements; 13 14 (3) be familiar with the proprietary technologies for 15 risk management, vulnerability management, security, and intrusion 16 detection; 17 (4) have significant experience with large governmental entities; 18 (5) be incorporated in this state or have its 19 principal place of business in this state; and 20 21 (6) have existing relationships with an institution of higher education and other information technology security 22 academies that provide network security education. 23 24 [Sections 2059.107-2059.150 reserved for expansion] 25 SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL PROVISIONS 26 Sec. 2059.151. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES. The department shall 27 develop a system of billings and charges for services provided in

operating and administering the network security system that 1 2 allocates the total state cost to each state agency or other entity 3 served by the system based on proportionate usage. 4 Sec. 2059.152. REVOLVING FUND ACCOUNT. (a) The 5 comptroller shall establish in the state treasury a revolving fund 6 account for the administration of this chapter. The account must be 7 used as a depository for money received from state agencies and other entities served under this chapter. Receipts attributable to 8 9 the centralized network security system must be deposited into the account and separately identified within the account. 10 (b) The legislature may appropriate money for operating the 11 system directly to the department, in which case the revolving fund 12 account must be used to receive money due from local governmental 13 entities and other agencies to the extent that their money is not 14 15 subject to legislative appropriation. 16 (c) The department shall maintain in the revolving fund 17 account sufficient amounts to pay the liabilities of the center and

18 related network security services.

19 <u>Sec. 2059.153. GRANTS. The department may apply for and use</u> 20 <u>for purposes of this chapter the proceeds from grants offered by any</u> 21 <u>federal agency or other source.</u>

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
