A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to health education curriculum and instruction in public 3 schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 28.004(e), Education Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: (e) Any course materials and instruction relating to human 7 sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, 8 or human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome 9 shall be selected by the board of trustees with the advice of the 10 11 local school health advisory council and must: 12 (1) provide a clear understanding of abstinence from 13 sexual activity and engaging in sexual activity; 14 (2) include strategies to promote effective communication between adolescents and their parents and family 15 16 members about human sexuality; (3) present abstinence from sexual activity as the 17 18 preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity for unmarried persons of school age; 19 (4) [(2)] devote more attention to abstinence from 20 21 sexual activity than to any other behavior; 22 (5) for circumstances in which a student is unable to 23 abstain from sexual activity, analyze the benefits of a healthy and monogamous sexual relationship and provide detailed information 24

3 (6) [(3)] emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method 4 5 that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and infection with human immunodeficiency 6 7 virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and is the preferred 8 method to prevent any [the] emotional trauma that may be associated 9 with adolescent sexual activity;

10 <u>(7)</u> [(4)] direct adolescents to a standard of behavior 11 in which abstinence from sexual activity before marriage is the 12 most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted 13 diseases, and infection with human immunodeficiency virus or 14 acquired immune deficiency syndrome;

15 <u>(8) for circumstances in which a student is unable to</u> 16 <u>abstain from sexual activity, provide detailed information on</u> 17 <u>testing for and preventing transmission of sexually transmitted</u> 18 diseases; [and]

19 <u>(9)</u> [(5)] teach contraception and condom use in <u>a</u> 20 <u>medically accurate manner that addresses the health benefits of</u> 21 <u>contraception and condom use and the</u> [terms of] human use reality 22 rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates, if instruction on 23 contraception and condoms is included in curriculum content;

24 (10) address the legal rights of victims of sexual 25 assault, including sexual abuse, and identify local agencies that 26 assist victims of sexual assault or that work to prevent sexual 27 assault;

1 (11) address the economic and emotional requirements 2 of fatherhood; and 3 (12) describe local services available to students who 4 are unable to abstain from sexual activity, including services for 5 adolescents who are pregnant or need postnatal medical care, child 6 care, or educational services.

SECTION 2. A school district that uses textbooks or other course materials that do not reflect the requirements prescribed by Section 28.004(e), Education Code, as amended by this Act, shall also use appropriate supplemental instructional materials as necessary to comply with those requirements.

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.

14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
