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H.B. No. 3138

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the registration of voters at a polling place and 3 related procedures.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 13.042(c), Election Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

(c) An application submitted after the <u>24th</u> [34th] day and
before the <u>19th</u> [29th] day before the date of an election in which
any qualified voter of the county is eligible to vote shall be
delivered not later than 5 p.m. of the <u>19th</u> [29th] day before
election day.

SECTION 2. Sections 13.143(a) and (e), Election Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (e), if an
applicant's registration application is approved, the registration
becomes effective on the <u>20th</u> [30th] day after the date the
application is submitted to the registrar or on the date the
applicant becomes 18 years of age, whichever is later.

(e) If the <u>20th</u> [30th] day before the date of an election is
a Saturday, Sunday, or legal state or national holiday, an
application is considered to be timely if it is submitted to the
registrar on or before the next regular business day.

23 SECTION 3. Section 18.042(a), Election Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

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1 (a) <u>On a date specified by the secretary of state that is</u> 2 [Not later than the 20th day] before the date of the general primary 3 election and the date of the general election for state and county 4 officers, the registrar shall file with the secretary of state a 5 statement of the number of persons whose voter registrations in the 6 county and in each county election precinct will be effective on 7 election day.

8 SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 61, Election Code, is 9 amended by adding Section 61.013 to read as follows:

Sec. 61.013. PRESENCE OF DEPUTY REGISTRAR. The registrar shall require a deputy registrar appointed under Section 12.006 or a volunteer deputy registrar appointed under Section 13.031 to be present at each polling place in the county on election day to provide for the registration of voters under Section 63.010.

SECTION 5. Chapter 63, Election Code, is amended by adding Section 63.010 to read as follows:

Sec. 63.010. REGISTRATION AT POLLING PLACE; VOTING PROCEDURES. (a) This section applies to the conduct of voting and to the registration of voters notwithstanding and in addition to other applicable provisions of this code.

(b) A person who would be eligible to vote in an election under Section 11.001, but for the requirement to be a registered voter, shall be accepted for voting in the precinct of the person's residence if, on the day the person offers to vote, the person submits a voter registration application that complies with Section 13.002 to the deputy registrar present at the polling place and: (1) presents proof of identification in a form

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1	described by Section 63.0101 that also establishes the person's
2	residence; or
3	(2) submits an affidavit that:
4	(A) is executed by the person in the presence of
5	the deputy registrar;
6	(B) states the person's residence address or, if
7	the residence has no address, states:
8	(i) the address at which the person
9	receives mail; and
10	(ii) a concise description of the location
11	of the person's residence; and
12	(C) states that the information submitted on the
13	voter registration application by the affiant is true.
14	(c) Persons voting under this section shall be processed
15	separately at the polling place from persons who are voting under
16	regular procedures.
17	(d) The secretary of state shall prescribe the procedures
18	necessary to implement this section, including the method for
19	adding a voter accepted under this section to the registration
20	list, and to ensure the proper and orderly conduct of elections.
21	SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
