9	(6-a) "Electronic access control device" means an
10	electronic, electrical, or computer-based device <u>, including a</u>

14	emergency services respond. The term does not include:

(10) a person who obtains a document for use in litigation under an authorization or subpoena issued for a written or oral deposition;

(11) an admitted insurer, insurance adjuster, agent, or insurance broker licensed by the state, performing duties in connection with insurance transacted by that person;

20 (12) a person who on the person's own property or on 21 property owned or managed by the person's employer:

(A) installs, changes, or repairs a mechanicalsecurity device;

(B) repairs an electronic security device; or
(C) cuts or makes a key for a security device; or
(13) security personnel, including security contract
personnel, working at a commercial nuclear power plant licensed by

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1 the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

2 SECTION 3. Section 1702.328, Occupations Code, is amended 3 to read as follows:

Sec. 1702.328. SECURITY SYSTEMS SALES 4 AND 5 INSTALLATION. This chapter does not apply to:

a person who owns and installs a burglar detection (1) 7 or alarm device on the person's own property or, if the person does 8 not charge for the device or the installation, installs the device for the protection of the person's personal property located on 9 another person's property and does not, as a normal business 10 practice, install the devices on the property of another; 11

a person in the business of building construction 12 (2) that installs electrical wiring and devices that may include in 13 14 part the installation of a burglar alarm or detection device if:

15 (A) the person is a party to a contract that provides that: 16

the installation will be 17 (i) performed under the direct supervision of, and inspected and certified by, a 18 person licensed to install and certify the alarm or detection 19 device; and 20

3 (4) a person who sells exclusively <u>by e-commerce</u>, over
4 the counter <u>transactions</u>, or [by] mail order, alarm systems,

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
