21	(b) To be eligible for appointment as a public member to the
22	commission, a person must have demonstrated experience in economic

1 use of airspace or outer space for future military missions.

2 (c) Appointments to the commission shall be made without 3 regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or 4 national origin of the appointee.

5 SECTION 2. Section 436.052(a), Government Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 (a) The <u>13</u> [mine] public members of the commission serve 8 staggered terms of six years with the terms of <u>four or five</u> 9 [one-third of the] members expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered 10 year. A legislative member vacates the person's position on the 11 commission if the person ceases to be the chair of the applicable 12 legislative committee.

SECTION 3. (a) Not later than October 1, 2005, the governor shall appoint the four additional public members of the Texas Military Preparedness Commission as required by Section 436.051, Government Code, as amended by this Act. The governor shall appoint:

18 (1) one public member to serve a term expiring19 February 1, 2007;

20 (2) one public member to serve a term expiring21 February 1, 2009; and

(3) two public members to serve terms expiringFebruary 1, 2011.

(b) Until all of the members appointed under this section
have qualified for office, a quorum of the commission is a majority
of the number of members who have qualified for office.

27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
