7	<u>Vessels</u> subject to the provisions of this chapter are divided into
8	four classes according to length as follows:
9	Class A. Less than 16 feet in length.
10	Class 1. 16 feet or over and less than 26 feet in length.
11	Class 2. 26 feet or over and less than 40 feet in length.
12	Class 3. 40 feet in length or over.
13	SECTION 2. Section 31.064 Parks & Wildlife Code, is amended

3 SECTION 4. Section 31.066 Parks & Wildlife Code, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 (a) A [motorboat] vessel must have at least one life 6 preserver[, life belt, ring buoy, or other device] of the sort 7 prescribed by [the] federal regulations [of the commandant of the 8 Coast Guard] for each person on board, so placed as to be readily 9 accessible.

10 (b) A [motorboat] <u>vessel</u> carrying passengers for hire must 11 have a readily accessible life preserver of the sort prescribed by 12 [the] <u>federal</u> regulations [of the commandant of the Coast Guard] 13 for each person on board.

(c) The operator of a class A or class 1 [motorboat] vessel,
while underway, shall require every passenger under 13 years of age
to wear a life preserver of the sort prescribed by the federal
regulations [of the commandant of the Coast Guard], unless each
such passenger is either below decks or in an enclosed cabin. [A
life belt or ring buoy does not satisfy this requirement.]

20 SECTION 5. Section 31.106(a)(5) Parks & Wildlife Code, is 21 deleted and renumbered accordingly to read as follows:

(7) [(8)] by jumping the wake of another vessel
recklessly or unnecessarily close to that vessel; or
(8) [(9)] in a manner that requires the operator to
swerve at the last possible moment to avoid collision.
SECTION 6. Section 31.106(d) Parks & Wildlife Code, is

(d) An owner of a personal watercraft may not permit

1 (3) [(4)] is not a resident of this state and has proof 2 that the person has successfully completed a boater education 3 course or equivalency examination in another state that is approved 4 by the department; or (4) [(5)] is exempt by rule of the department. 5 6 SECTION 13. Section 31.110(2) Parks & Wildlife Code, is 7 deleted, to read as follows: [(b) If the person fails to successfully complete the boater 8 education course, the person commits an offense that is a Class A 9 Parks and Wildlife Code misdemeanor.] 10

SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
