## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to hiring Teacher Retirement System of Texas retirees to
3	fill positions in acute shortage areas.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding 6 Subchapter O to read as follows:
- SUBCHAPTER O. HIRING OF RETIREES FOR ACUTE SHORTAGE AREAS 7
- Sec. 21.701. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 8
- 9 (1) "Acute shortage area" means a school district job description for which the supply of qualified applicants is 10 11 extremely limited as determined by the commissioner under Section 12 21.702.
- 13 (2) "Region" means one of the geographic areas of this state associated with a regional education service center 14 established under Section 8.001. 15
- 16 (3) "Retiree" means a person who receives an annuity based on service in the Teacher Retirement System of Texas that was 17 18 credited to the person.
- Sec. 21.702. GUIDELINES FOR HIRING IN ACUTE SHORTAGE AREAS. 19 (a) Each May and November, the commissioner shall update and 20 21 disseminate guidelines for use by school districts in determining whether a position a district is attempting to fill is a position in 22 23 an acute shortage area. The guidelines must include:
- (1) a list of acute shortage areas by region and 24

- 1 statewide; and
- 2 (2) a requirement that in hiring for a position a
- 3 school district shall give preference to an applicant who is not a
- 4 retiree.
- 5 (b) In preparing the list of acute shortage areas, the
- 6 commissioner shall use the most recent school district reports
- 7 <u>submitted under Section 21.703.</u>
- 8 Sec. 21.703. REPORT ON ACUTE SHORTAGE AREA APPLICANTS
- 9 HIRED. To provide information needed by the commissioner and the
- 10 legislature, not later than October 31 and April 30 of each academic
- 11 year, a school district must submit to the commissioner a report as
- 12 prescribed by the commissioner for the current semester. The
- 13 report must state separately the number of individuals hired by the
- 14 district for each acute shortage area or other position in the
- 15 district who:
- 16 (1) are retirees; or
- 17 (2) at the time of being hired for the position, were
- 18 not qualified by prior experience, training, certification, or
- 19 license, as applicable to the position.
- Sec. 21.704. REPORT TO GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE. Not later
- 21 than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the commissioner shall
- 22 prepare a report on acute shortage areas that highlights important
- 23 <u>information</u> in an executive summary and consolidates the
- 24 information in the guidelines under Section 21.702 for the
- 25 preceding 24-month period. The commissioner shall provide the
- 26 report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the
- 27 house of representatives, and the presiding officers of the

- 1 standing committees of the legislature with primary jurisdiction
- 2 over public education or public retirement systems.
- 3 Sec. 21.705. AGENCY RULES RELATED TO ACUTE SHORTAGE AREA
- 4 HIRING AND REPORTING. The commissioner may adopt rules as needed to
- 5 implement this subchapter.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 824.602(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Subject to Section 825.506, the retirement system may
- 9 not, under Section 824.601, withhold a monthly benefit payment if
- 10 the retiree is employed in a Texas public educational institution:
- 11 (1) as a substitute only with pay not more than the
- daily rate of substitute pay established by the employer and, if the
- 13 retiree is a disability retiree, the employment has not exceeded a
- 14 total of 90 days in the school year;
- 15 (2) in a position, other than as a substitute, on no
- 16 more than a one-half time basis for the month;
- 17 (3) in one or more positions on as much as a full-time
- 18 basis, if the work occurs in not more than six months of a school
- 19 year that begins after the retiree's effective date of retirement;
- 20 (4) in a position, other than as a substitute, on no
- 21 more than a one-half time basis for no more than 90 days in the
- 22 school year, if the retiree is a disability retiree;
- 23 (5) in a position as a classroom teacher on as much as
- 24 a full-time basis, if the retiree has retired under Section
- 824.202(a), is certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education
- 26 Code, to teach the subjects assigned, is teaching in an acute
- 27 shortage area as determined by the commissioner of education under

- 1 <u>Section 21.702, Education Code</u> [board of trustees of a school
- 2 district as provided by Subsection (m), and has been separated
- 3 from service with all public schools for at least one month  $[\frac{12}{2}]$
- 4 months];
- 5 (6) in a position as a principal, including as an
- 6 assistant principal, on as much as a full-time basis, if the retiree
- 7 has retired under Section 824.202(a) without reduction for
- 8 retirement at an early age, is certified under Subchapter B,
- 9 Chapter 21, Education Code, to serve as a principal, and has been
- 10 separated from service with all public schools for at least 12
- 11 months; or
- 12 (7) as a bus driver for a school district on as much as
- 13 a full-time basis, if the retiree has retired under Section
- 14 824.202(a).
- SECTION 3. Section 824.602(m), Government Code, is
- 16 repealed.
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 824.602, Government Code, as amended by
- 18 this Act, applies to a retiree of the Teacher Retirement System of
- 19 Texas hired to fill a position as a classroom teacher in an acute
- shortage area beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
