- 5 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 6 43.181 and 45.179, Government Code, apply only to a proceeding
- 7 commenced on or after the effective date of this Act. A proceeding
- 8 commenced before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 9 law in effect on the date the proceeding was commenced, and the
- 10 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
