4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 43.033, Local Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Subsections (c)-(f) to read as follows:
7	(c) If the area is disannexed as provided by Subsection (b),
8	the area is not released from its pro rata share of any indebtedness
9	that, at the time of the disannexation the municipality owes, by
10	bond or otherwise, for infrastructure provided to the area.
11	(d) Until the municipal fees, assessments, and property
12	taxes collected from the area equal the area's pro rata share of the
13	indebtedness, the governing body of the municipality shall continue
14	to levy:
15	(1) any fees or assessments applicable to the area
16	that are provided by law or agreement; and
17	(2) a property tax each year on the property in the
18	area at the same rate that is levied on other property in the
19	municipality.
20	(e) The municipality shall apply the fees, assessments, and
21	taxes collected under Subsection (d) exclusively to the payment of:
22	(1) the pro rata share of the area's indebtedness; and
23	(2) the costs of levying and collecting the fees,
24	assessments, and taxes in the area.

1 (f) Subsection (d) does not prevent the residents of the 2 area from paying in full at any time the area's pro rata share of any 3 indebtedness.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to an area that is disannexed on or after the effective date of this Act. An area that is disannexed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
