4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 202.021, Transportation Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2002.021. REAL PROPERTY NO LONGER NEEDED.
8	(a) The commission may recommend to the governor the sale or
9	transfer of any interest in real property, including a highway
10	right-of-way, that:
11	(1) was acquired for a highway purpose; and
12	(2) as determined by the commission, is no longer
13	needed for a state highway purpose.
14	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), real property
15	shall be transferred or sold with the following properties:
16	(1) to a governmental entity with the authority to
17	condemn the property; or
18	(2) to a federally recognized Indian tribe whose
19	reservation is along the Texas-Mexico border; or
20	(3) to the general public.
21	(c) A highway right-of-way shall be transferred or sold with
22	the following priorities:
23	(1) to a governmental entity with the authority to
24	condemn the property;

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(2) to abutting or adjoining landowners; or 1 2 to a federally recognized Indian tribe whose (3) 3 reservation is along the Texas-Mexico border; or 4 (4) to the general public. 5 (d) The commission shall: 6 (1) determine the fair value of the state's interest in 7 the real property; and 8 (2) if the value is \$10,000 or more, advise the 9 governor of the value. (e) The commission may waive payment for real property 10 transferred to a governmental entity under this section if the 11 estimated cost of future maintenance on the property equals or 12 exceeds the fair value of the property. 13 14 (f) Any revenue from the sale of property under this 15 subchapter shall be deposited to the credit of the state highway 16 fund. 17 (g) The governor may execute a deed conveying the state's interest in the property. 18 If the commission determines that value of the real 19 (h) property is less than \$10,000, it may authorize the executive 20 director to execute a deed conveying the state's interest in the 21 property without a recommendation to the governor. 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 23 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2005. 27

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
