| 4  | SECTION 1. Chapter 434, Government Code, is amended by               |
| 5  | adding Subchapter D to read as follows:                              |
| 6  | SUBCHAPTER D. TEXAS HOMEFRONT HEROES PROGRAM                         |
| 7  | Sec. 434.151. TEXAS HOMEFRONT HEROES PROGRAM. (a) The                |
| 8  | Texas Homefront Heroes program is established to provide temporary   |
| 9  | financial assistance and other services to the family members of     |
| 10 | personnel on active duty with the army, navy, air force, coast       |
| 11 | guard, or marine corps of the United States or an auxiliary service  |
| 12 | or reserve unit of one of those branches of the armed forces, or the |
| 13 | state military forces, as defined by Section 431.001.                |
| 14 | (b) The Texas Veterans Commission, in consultation with the          |
| 15 | advisory committee established under Section 434.153, shall adopt    |
| 16 | rules as necessary to implement the program.                         |
| 17 | Sec. 434.152. HOMEFRONT HEROES ACCOUNT. (a) The homefront            |
| 18 | heroes account is created in the general revenue fund.               |
| 19 | (b) Money in the homefront heroes account may be                     |
| 20 | appropriated only for the purposes of this subchapter.               |
| 21 | (c) The Texas Veterans Commission may accept grants, gifts,          |
| 22 | or legislative appropriations from any public or private source for  |
| 23 | the purposes of the program and shall deposit any money received as  |
| 24 | a grant, gift, or appropriation to the credit of the homefront       |

| 2  | Sec. 434.153. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The Texas Veterans            |
| 3  | Commission shall establish a homefront heroes advisory committee to |
| 4  | assist the commission in implementing the program created under     |
| 5  | this subchapter.  |
| 6  | (b) The advisory committee is:                                      |
| 7  | (1) composed of nine members who are family members of              |
| 8  | active duty military personnel; and                                 |
| 9  | (2) appointed by the Texas Veterans Commission.                     |
| 10 | (c) Members of the advisory committee serve without                 |
| 11 | compensation but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary         |
| 12 | expenses related to the performance of committee duties.            |
| 13 | (d) Reimbursement of expenses under Subsection (c) is               |
| 14 | subject to approval by the Texas Veterans Commission.               |
| 15 | (e) The members of the advisory committee shall elect a             |
| 16 | presiding officer from among the members and shall adopt rules      |
| 17 | governing the operation of the committee.                           |
| 18 | (f) The advisory committee shall meet at the call of the            |
| 19 | presiding officer at least once each year.                          |
| 20 | (g) The committee shall make recommendations to the Texas           |
| 21 | Veterans Commission regarding:                                      |
| 22 | (1) eligibility criteria for the Texas Homefront                    |
| 23 | Heroes program;   |
| 24 | (2) the application process for the program; and                    |
| 25 | (3) the services that should be provided under the                  |
| 26 | program, including:   |
| 27 | (A) temporary financial assistance for recurring                    |

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## 1 monthly expenses; 2 (B) child care services; 3 (C) health care; 4 (D) education; and 5 (E) employment and job training. 6 (h) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the advisory committee. 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
