- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.2292, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsection (n) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (a) In addition to the jurisdiction provided by Section
- 9 25.0003 and other law, a county court at law in Travis County has
- 10 concurrent jurisdiction with the district court in civil cases
- 11 <u>regardless of the amount</u> [<u>in which the matter</u>] in controversy <u>and in</u>
- 12 <u>family law cases and proceedings</u> [exceeds \$500 but does not exceed
- 13 \$250,000, excluding interest, statutory or punitive damages and
- 14 penalties, and attorney's fees and costs, as alleged on the face of
- 15 the petition].
- 16 (d) In civil cases, the jury is composed of six members
- 17 unless a party to the case files a written request for a 12-member
- 18 jury not later than the 30th day before the date of the trial and:
- 19 (1) the amount in controversy exceeds \$100,000; or
- 20 [and]
- 21 (2) a party is requesting relief under Title 1 or 5,
- 22 Family Code [a party to the case files a written request for a
- 23 12-member jury not later than the 30th day before the date of the
- 24 **trial**].

- 1 (n) The district clerk serves as clerk of a county court at
- 2 law in all cases arising under Title 1 or 5, Family Code.
- 3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to an action filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 5 action filed before the effective date of this Act is covered by the
- 6 law in effect on the date the action was filed, and the former law is
- 7 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
