3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 504.502, Transportation Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	Sec. 504.502. CERTAIN EXHIBITION VEHICLES;
7	OFFENSE. (a) The department shall issue specialty license plates
8	for a passenger car, truck, motorcycle, or former military vehicle
9	that:
10	(1) is at least 25 years old, if the vehicle is a
11	passenger car, truck, or motorcycle;
12	<pre>(2) is a collector's item;</pre>
13	(3) is used exclusively for exhibitions, club
14	activities, parades, and other functions of public interest and is
15	not used for regular transportation; and
16	(4) does not carry advertising.
17	(b) The license plates must include the words "Antique
18	Auto," "Antique Truck," "Antique Motorcycle," or "Military
19	Vehicle," as appropriate.
20	(c) A person eligible for the license plates may instead use
21	license plates issued by this state in the same year as the model
22	year of the vehicle and approved by the department, provided that a
23	passenger car must bear passenger car or truck license plates and a
24	truck must bear passenger car or truck license plates. The

department may require attachment of a registration insignia to the license plate in a manner that does not affect the display of information originally on the license plate.

4 (d) License plates issued or approved under this section5 expire on the fifth anniversary of the date of issuance or approval.

6 (e) The fee for issuance or approval of license plates under7 this section is:

8 (1) \$10 for each year or portion of a year remaining in 9 the five-year registration period if the vehicle was manufactured 10 in 1921 or later; or

(2) \$8 for each year or portion of a year remaining in the five-year registration period if the vehicle was manufactured before 1921.

(f) The department may exempt a former military vehicle from the requirement to display a license plate or registration insignia if the exemption is necessary to maintain the vehicle's accurate military markings. The department may approve an alternative registration insignia that is compatible with the vehicle's original markings.

(g) A person entitled to specialty license plates or to department approval under this section may register the vehicle without payment of any fees paid for or at the time of registration except the fee for the license plate. An owner of a vehicle registered under this subsection who violates this section commits an offense. An offense under this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$5 or more than \$200.

27 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a vehicle

issued license plates under Subsection (a) shall be required to 1 2 attach and display only one license plate on the rear of the 3 vehicle. 4 (i) In this section, "former military vehicle" means a vehicle, including a trailer, regardless of the vehicle's size, 5 6 weight, or year of manufacture, that: 7 (1) was manufactured for use in any country's military forces; and 8 is maintained to represent its military design and 9 (2) markings accurately. 10 11 (j) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that a vehicle is in route to or from a location for the 12 purpose of routine maintenance. 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005. 14
