| 6  | SECTION 1. Section 386.051(b), Health and Safety Code, is           |
| 7  | amended to read as follows:                                         |
| 8  | (b) Under the plan, the commission and the comptroller shall        |
| 9  | provide grants or other funding for:                                |
| 10 | (1) the diesel emissions reduction incentive program                |
| 11 | established under Subchapter C, including for infrastructure        |
| 12 | projects established under that subchapter;                         |
| 13 | (2) the motor vehicle purchase or lease incentive                   |
| 14 | program established under Subchapter D; [ <del>and</del> ]          |
| 15 | (3) the new technology research and development                     |
| 16 | program established under Chapter 387; and                          |
| 17 | (4) the clean school bus program established under                  |
| 18 | Chapter 390.                                                        |
| 19 | SECTION 2. Section 386.052(b), Health and Safety Code, is           |
| 20 | amended to read as follows:                                         |
| 21 | (b) Appropriate commission objectives include:                      |
| 22 | (1) achieving maximum reductions in oxides of nitrogen              |
| 23 | to demonstrate compliance with the state implementation plan;       |
| 24 | (2) preventing areas of the state from being in                     |

1 violation of national ambient air quality standards; [and]

2 (3) achieving cost-saving and multiple benefits by
3 reducing emissions of other pollutants; and

4 <u>(4) achieving reductions of emissions of diesel</u> 5 <u>exhaust from school buses</u>.

6 SECTION 3. Section 386.252, Health and Safety Code, is 7 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to 8 read as follows:

9 (a) Money in the fund may be used only to implement and 10 administer programs established under the plan and shall be 11 allocated as follows:

(1) for the diesel emissions reduction incentive program, 87.5 percent of the money in the fund, of which not more than <u>four percent may be used for the clean school bus program and</u> <u>not more than</u> 10 percent may be used for on-road diesel purchase or lease incentives;

(2) for the new technology research and development 17 program, 9.5 percent of the money in the fund, of which up to 18 \$250,000 is allocated for administration, up to \$200,000 19 is allocated for a health effects study, \$500,000 is to be deposited in 20 the state treasury to the credit of the clean air account created 21 under Section 382.0622 to supplement funding for air quality 22 planning activities in affected counties, and not less than 20 23 24 percent is to be allocated each year to support research related to 25 air quality for the Houston-Galveston-Brazoria and Dallas-Fort Worth nonattainment areas by a nonprofit organization based in 26 27 Houston; and

| 3  | (c) Money in the fund may be allocated to the clean school           |
| 4  | bus program only if:                                                 |
| 5  | (1) the money is available for that purpose after                    |
| 6  | money is allocated for the other purposes of the fund as required by |
| 7  | the state implementation plan; or                                    |
| 8  | (2) the amount of money deposited to the credit of the               |
| 9  | fund in a state fiscal year exceeds the amount the comptroller's     |
| 10 | biennial revenue estimate shows as the comptroller's estimated       |
| 11 | amount to be deposited to the credit of the fund in that year.       |
| 12 | SECTION 4. Subtitle C, Title 5, Health and Safety Code, is           |
| 13 | amended by adding Chapter 390 to read as follows:                    |
| 14 | CHAPTER 390. CLEAN SCHOOL BUS PROGRAM                                |
| 15 | Sec. 390.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:                          |
| 16 | (1) "Diesel exhaust" means one or more of the air                    |
| 17 | pollutants emitted from an engine by the combustion of diesel fuel,  |
| 18 | including particulate matter, nitrogen oxides, volatile organic      |
| 19 | compounds, air toxics, and carbon monoxide.                          |
| 20 | (2) "Incremental cost" has the meaning assigned by                   |
| 21 | <u>Section 386.001.</u>                                              |
| 22 | (3) "Program" means the clean school bus program                     |
| 23 | established under this chapter.                                      |
| 24 | (4) "Qualifying fuel" includes any liquid or gaseous                 |
| 25 | fuel or additive registered or verified by the United States         |
| 26 | Environmental Protection Agency, other than standard gasoline or     |
| 27 | diesel, that is ultimately dispensed into a school bus that          |

| 1  | provides reductions of emissions of particulate matter.             |
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| 2  | (5) "Retrofit" has the meaning assigned by Section                  |
| 3  | 386.101.                                                            |
| 4  | Sec. 390.002. PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish           |
| 5  | and administer a clean school bus program designed to reduce the    |
| 6  | exposure of school children to diesel exhaust in and around         |
| 7  | diesel-fueled school buses. Under the program, the commission       |
| 8  | shall provide grants for eligible projects to offset the            |
| 9  | incremental cost of projects that reduce emissions of diesel        |
| 10 | exhaust.                                                            |
| 11 | (b) Projects that may be considered for a grant under the           |
| 12 | program include:                                                    |
| 13 | (1) diesel oxidation catalysts for school buses built               |
| 14 | before 1994;                                                        |
| 15 | (2) diesel particulate filters for school buses built               |
| 16 | <u>from 1994 to 1998;</u>                                           |
| 17 | (3) the purchase and use of emission-reducing add-on                |
| 18 | equipment for school buses, including devices that reduce crankcase |
| 19 | emissions;                                                          |
| 20 | (4) the use of qualifying fuel; and                                 |
| 21 | (5) other technologies that the commission finds will               |
| 22 | bring about significant emissions reductions.                       |
| 23 | Sec. 390.003. APPLICATION FOR GRANT. (a) A school district          |
| 24 | in this state that operates one or more diesel-fueled school buses  |
| 25 | or a transportation system provided by a countywide school district |
| 26 | may apply for and receive a grant under the program.                |
| 27 | (b) The commission may adopt guidelines to allow a regional         |

planning commission, council of governments, or similar regional 1 2 planning agency created under Chapter 391, Local Government Code, or a private nonprofit organization to also apply for and receive a 3 4 grant to improve the ability of the program to achieve its goals. (c) An application for a grant under this chapter must be 5 6 made on a form provided by the commission and must contain the 7 information required by the commission. Sec. 390.004. ELIGIBILITY OF PROJECTS FOR GRANTS. (a) The 8 9 commission by rule shall establish criteria for setting priorities for projects eligible to receive grants under this chapter. The 10 commission shall review and may modify the criteria and priorities 11 12 as appropriate. (b) A school bus proposed for retrofit must be used on a 13 14 regular, daily route to and from a school and have at least five 15 years of useful life remaining unless the applicant agrees to remove the retrofit device at the end of the life of the bus and 16 17 reinstall the device on another bus. Sec. 390.005. RESTRICTION ON USE OF GRANT. A recipient of a 18 19 grant under this chapter shall use the grant to pay the incremental costs of the project for which the grant is made, which may include 20 21 the reasonable and necessary expenses incurred for the labor needed to install emissions-reducing equipment. The recipient may not use 22 the grant to pay the recipient's administrative expenses. 23 24 Sec. 390.006. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires August 31, 2013. 25 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
