A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the establishment of a program to provide grants to be

- 3 used to reduce emissions of diesel exhaust from school buses and to
- 4 the use of the Texas emissions reduction plan to fund the program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 386.051(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Under the plan, the commission and the comptroller shall
- 9 provide grants or other funding for:
- 10 (1) the diesel emissions reduction incentive program
- 11 established under Subchapter C, including for infrastructure
- 12 projects established under that subchapter;
- 13 (2) the motor vehicle purchase or lease incentive
- 14 program established under Subchapter D; [and]
- 15 (3) the new technology research and development
- 16 program established under Chapter 387; and
- 17 (4) the clean school bus program established under
- 18 <u>Chapter 390</u>.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 386.052(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (b) Appropriate commission objectives include:
- 22 (1) achieving maximum reductions in oxides of nitrogen
- 23 to demonstrate compliance with the state implementation plan;
- 24 (2) preventing areas of the state from being in

- violation of national ambient air quality standards; [and]
- 2 (3) achieving cost-saving and multiple benefits by
- 3 reducing emissions of other pollutants; and
- 4 (4) achieving reductions of emissions of diesel
- 5 exhaust from school buses.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 386.252, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (a) Money in the fund may be used only to implement and
- 10 administer programs established under the plan and shall be
- 11 allocated as follows:
- 12 (1) for the diesel emissions reduction incentive
- 13 program, 87.5 percent of the money in the fund, of which not more
- 14 than 1.5 percent may be used for the clean school bus program and
- not more than 10 percent may be used for on-road diesel purchase or
- 16 lease incentives;
- 17 (2) for the new technology research and development
- 18 program, 9.5 percent of the money in the fund, of which up to
- 19 \$250,000 is allocated for administration, up to \$200,000 is
- allocated for a health effects study, \$500,000 is to be deposited in
- 21 the state treasury to the credit of the clean air account created
- 22 under Section 382.0622 to supplement funding for air quality
- 23 planning activities in affected counties, and not less than 20
- 24 percent is to be allocated each year to support research related to
- 25 air quality for the Houston-Galveston-Brazoria and Dallas-Fort
- 26 Worth nonattainment areas by a nonprofit organization based in
- 27 Houston; and

- 1 (3) for administrative costs incurred by the
- 2 commission and the laboratory, three percent.
- 3 (c) Money in the fund may be allocated to the clean school
- 4 bus program only if the money is available for that purpose after
- 5 money is allocated as needed to achieve the emissions reduction
- 6 objectives in the state implementation plan.
- 7 SECTION 4. Subtitle C, Title 5, Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Chapter 390 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 390. CLEAN SCHOOL BUS PROGRAM

- Sec. 390.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 11 (1) "Diesel exhaust" means one or more of the air
- 12 pollutants emitted from an engine by the combustion of diesel fuel,
- 13 <u>including particulate matter, nitrogen oxides, volatile organic</u>
- 14 compounds, air toxics, and carbon monoxide.
- 15 (2) "Incremental cost" has the meaning assigned by
- 16 <u>Section 386.001.</u>

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- 17 <u>(3) "Program" means the clean school bus program</u>
- 18 <u>established under this chapt</u>er.
- 19 (4) "Qualifying fuel" includes any liquid or gaseous
- 20 fuel or additive registered or verified by the United States
- 21 Environmental Protection Agency, other than standard gasoline or
- 22 diesel, that is ultimately dispensed into a school bus that
- 23 provides reductions of emissions of particulate matter.
- 24 (5) "Retrofit" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 25 386.101.
- Sec. 390.002. PROGRAM. (a) The commission shall establish
- 27 and administer a clean school bus program designed to reduce the

- 1 <u>exposure</u> of school children to diesel exhaust in and around
- 2 <u>diesel-fueled</u> school buses. Under the program, the commission
- 3 shall provide grants for eligible projects to offset the
- 4 incremental cost of projects that reduce emissions of diesel
- 5 exhaust.
- 6 (b) Projects that may be considered for a grant under the
- 7 program include:
- 8 (1) diesel oxidation catalysts for school buses built
- 9 <u>before 1994;</u>
- 10 (2) diesel particulate filters for school buses built
- 11 from 1994 to 1998;
- 12 (3) the purchase and use of emission-reducing add-on
- 13 equipment for school buses, including devices that reduce crankcase
- 14 emissions;
- 15 (4) the use of qualifying fuel; and
- 16 (5) other technologies that the commission finds will
- 17 bring about significant emissions reductions.
- 18 Sec. 390.003. APPLICATION FOR GRANT. (a) A school district
- in this state that operates one or more diesel-fueled school buses
- or a transportation system provided by a countywide school district
- 21 may apply for and receive a grant under the program.
- 22 (b) The commission may adopt guidelines to allow a regional
- 23 planning commission, council of governments, or similar regional
- 24 planning agency created under Chapter 391, Local Government Code,
- or a private nonprofit organization to also apply for and receive a
- 26 grant to improve the ability of the program to achieve its goals.
- (c) An application for a grant under this chapter must be

- 1 made on a form provided by the commission and must contain the
- 2 information required by the commission.
- 3 Sec. 390.004. ELIGIBILITY OF PROJECTS FOR GRANTS. (a) The
- 4 commission by rule shall establish criteria for setting priorities
- 5 for projects eligible to receive grants under this chapter. The
- 6 commission shall review and may modify the criteria and priorities
- 7 <u>as appropriate.</u>
- 8 (b) A school bus proposed for retrofit must be used on a
- 9 regular, daily route to and from a school and have at least five
- 10 years of useful life remaining unless the applicant agrees to
- 11 remove the retrofit device at the end of the life of the bus and
- 12 reinstall the device on another bus.
- 13 Sec. 390.005. RESTRICTION ON USE OF GRANT. A recipient of a
- 14 grant under this chapter shall use the grant to pay the incremental
- 15 costs of the project for which the grant is made, which may include
- the reasonable and necessary expenses incurred for the labor needed
- 17 to install emissions-reducing equipment. The recipient may not use
- 18 the grant to pay the recipient's administrative expenses.
- 19 Sec. 390.006. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires August 31,
- 20 2013.
- 21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
