5	SECTION 1. Section 31.03(f), Penal Code, is amended to read
6	as follows:
7	(f) An offense described for purposes of punishment by
8	Subsections (e)(1)-(6) is increased to the next higher category of
9	offense if it is shown on the trial of the offense that:
10	(1) the actor was a public servant at the time of the
11	offense and the property appropriated came into the actor's
12	custody, possession, or control by virtue of his status as a public
13	servant;
14	(2) the actor was in a contractual relationship with
15	government at the time of the offense and the property appropriated
16	came into the actor's custody, possession, or control by virtue of
17	the contractual relationship; [or]
18	(3) the owner of the property appropriated was at the
19	time of the offense an elderly individual <u>; or</u>
20	(4) the offense was committed at a location where a
21	natural disaster, including a tornado, hurricane, flood, or fire,
22	was occurring at the time of the offense or occurred immediately
23	before the offense was committed.
24	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the
former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
this section, an offense is committed before the effective date of
this Act if any element of the offense occurs before the effective
date.
