H.B. No. 3520

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the distribution of assessments charged by  
3 Bexar-Medina-Atascosa Counties Water Control and Improvement  
4 District No. 1.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. The maximum and minimum limitations provided by  
7 Section 51.305(a), Water Code, on the portion of the estimated  
8 maintenance and operating expenses of a water control and  
9 improvement district that may be paid by an assessment against land  
10 in the district to which the district can furnish water through its  
11 irrigation system or through an extension of its irrigation system  
12 do not apply to Bexar-Medina-Atascosa Counties Water Control and  
13 Improvement District No. 1.

14 SECTION 2. (a) The legal notice of the intention to  
15 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this  
16 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a  
17 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,  
18 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished  
19 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,  
20 Government Code.

21 (b) The governor has submitted the notice and Act to the  
22 Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

23 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed  
24 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor,

1 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives  
2 within the required time.

3 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this  
4 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect  
5 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled  
6 and accomplished.

7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
11 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
