The district is a municipal utility district in Galveston County created under and 14 essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 59, Article XVI, 15 16 Texas Constitution. Sec. 8130.003. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Except as 17 18 otherwise provided by this chapter, the following laws apply to the 19 district: (1) Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, including 20 Subchapter J, Chapter 54, Water Code, notwithstanding the 21 limitation on authorization based on acreage under Section 54.801 22 23 of that code; and 24 (2) Section 52(b)(3), Article III, Texas

12	Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
13	copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
14	officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
15	under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,

16 Government Code.

(b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

20 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 21 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 22 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 23 representatives within the required time.

(d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
and accomplished.
