## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the compensation of official court reporters for 3 statutory county courts in Webb County.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 52, Government Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 52.0532 to read as follows:
- Sec. 52.0532. COMPENSATION OF WEBB COUNTY OFFICIAL COURT

  REPORTER. (a) An official court reporter for a statutory county

  court in Webb County shall be paid a salary set by the order of the
- 10 judge of the court the reporter serves. This salary is in addition
- 11 to transcript fees, fees for a statement of facts, and other
- 12 necessary expenses authorized by law.
- (b) An order increasing the salary of an official court
- 14 reporter for a statutory county court in Webb County must be
- 15 submitted to the Commissioners Court of Webb County not later than
- 16 September 1 immediately before the adoption of the county budget
- 17 for the next year. The commissioners court may allow an extension
- 18 of this time limit.
- 19 (c) The official court reporter for a statutory county court
- 20 <u>in Webb County may not receive a salary that is more than 10 percent</u>
- 21 greater than the salary received during the preceding budget year
- 22 without the approval of the Commissioners Court of Webb County.
- 23 (d) A person appointed to succeed an official court reporter
- 24 for a statutory county court may not receive a salary greater than

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- 1 the salary received by the person's predecessor in office.
- 2 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act by adding
- 3 Section 52.0532, Government Code, apply only to the salary of an
- 4 official court reporter for a statutory county court in Webb County
- 5 set on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
