## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Known throughout the world as an inexhaustible
- 2 source of every variety of American music, Texas boasts
- 3 particularly rich reserves of the distinctive musical genre known
- 4 as the blues; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The community of Navasota exemplifies the Lone Star
- 6 State's strengths in this area, combining as it does a lively
- 7 contemporary blues scene with the birthplace of one of the great
- 8 Texas blues artists; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Blues aficionados are well aware that the beloved
- 10 singer and guitarist Mance Lipscomb was born near Navasota, and
- 11 although he was almost 65 years of age before he committed his
- 12 distinctive performance style to a recording, his wide-ranging
- 13 repertoire of blues, boogies, ballads, rags, dance tunes, and
- 14 sacred music is an apt reflection of the breadth of his home state's
- 15 musical treasures; and
- WHEREAS, Mance Lipscomb's heritage lives on in present-day
- 17 Navasota, where the heirs to this profound musical legacy have
- 18 created the Navasota Blues Fest; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Navasota Blues Fest not only brings together
- 20 blues musicians for an annual celebration of regional music but
- 21 also administers the Mance Lipscomb Scholarship Fund, which each
- 22 year awards a scholarship to a deserving senior at Navasota High
- 23 School; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Just as Mance Lipscomb personified Texas music in

- 1 his encyclopedic grasp of a host of musical styles, so the city of
- 2 Navasota is a fitting representative of the richness, power, and
- 3 variety of the Texas blues tradition; now, therefore, be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the 79th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 5 hereby designate Navasota as the official Blues Capital of Texas.
