HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The citizens of Midland and Odessa are justly proud
of the many contributions their communities have made to the
building of the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, Located in the Permian Basin, at the southern edge of the High Plains, the cities stand some 20 miles apart and have been shaped by similar historical forces; both originated in the early 1880s as stopping places along the Texas and Pacific Railway, and, within a few years of their founding, each had become the seat of a newly organized county government; today, Midland and Odessa are home to the overwhelming majority of citizens in Midland and Ector Counties, respectively; and

WHEREAS, Originally trade and shipping centers for the surrounding ranches, the towns also became important petroleum centers in the 1920s, when oil was discovered in the Permian Basin; Midland subsequently developed into an administrative center for the oil and gas industry, while Odessa became the location of what is now the largest inland petrochemical complex in the nation; and

WHEREAS, During World War II, the economy of the area benefited from the presence of the Midland Army Air Force Base; one of the largest training facilities in the world at that time, the base was home to the Army Air Force Bombardier School from 1942 to 1945; and

23 WHEREAS, United under the slogan "Two Cities--No Limits," 24 leaders in both communities have worked together to establish the

- 2 Alliance; in addition, they have created the Midland-Odessa Health
- 3 and Retirement Endeavor, which promotes the attractiveness of the
- 4 area as a retirement locale; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Support for expanding the economic base is also
- 6 provided by the Center for Energy and Economic Diversification at
- 7 The University of Texas of the Permian Basin (UTPB); in recent
- 8 years, Midland and Odessa have welcomed several major new employers
- 9 to the area--a distribution center for Family Dollar Stores, Inc.,
- 10 a Texas Independent Energy power plant, and a Cingular Wireless
- 11 Call Center; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Both cities can claim the distinction of having been
- 13 home to two presidents, George H. W. Bush and George W. Bush, and
- 14 visitors to Midland can now tour the George W. Bush Childhood Home;
- 15 and
- WHEREAS, Midland also boasts the western history center and
- 17 library established by J. Evetts and Nita Stewart Haley; the Museum
- of the Southwest; The Petroleum Museum, with its extensive archival
- 19 collection and a new gallery devoted to Jim Hall and his Chaparral
- 20 race cars; and the museum of the Commemorative Air Force, which
- 21 possesses the most complete collection of flyable World War II
- 22 combat aircraft in the country; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Significant cultural resources in Odessa include
- the Ellen Noel Art Museum of the Permian Basin, a replica of the
- 25 Globe Theatre, where modern and classical works are staged, and a
- 26 museum devoted to the U.S. presidency; since a merger of talents in
- 27 1962, the Midland-Odessa Symphony and Chorale has further enriched

- 1 the cultural life of the communities; and
- WHEREAS, Area residents are fortunate to have a number of
- 3 institutions of higher education in their midst--UTPB and a campus
- 4 of the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, both in
- 5 Odessa, as well as Midland College and Odessa College; and
- 6 WHEREAS, For nearly a century and a quarter, the citizens of
- 7 Midland and Odessa have sought to preserve the best of their past
- 8 while working to build an even brighter and more promising future
- 9 for their children, and it is a pleasure to join in commemorating
- 10 their outstanding achievements; now, therefore, be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the 79th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 12 hereby designate February 15 as Midland-Odessa Day at the State
- 13 Capitol.
