HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Alphonso Jackson, Secretary of the 2 United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, is an 3 outstanding Texan who has rendered immeasurable service to the 4 citizens of Texas and the United States; and

5 WHEREAS, Nominated by President George W. Bush, Secretary Jackson was unanimously confirmed by the United States Senate as 6 the nation's 13th Secretary of Housing and Urban Development on 7 March 31, 2004; with that appointment, he inherited an enormous 8 challenge as the president set a goal two years ago for the creation 9 of 5.5 million new minority homeowners by the end of the decade; 10 11 Secretary Jackson has boldly risen to that challenge and, to date, 12 there has been a net increase of 2.2 million minority homeowners in the country, which represents a remarkable 40 percent of the 13 14 president's goal; and

WHEREAS, Under Secretary Jackson's leadership, sales of new 15 single-family homes in the United States have set a record with 1.2 16 million sales in 2004, a nine percent increase above the record set 17 18 the previous year; a new national homeownership record was also set in 2004, with 69 percent of American families owning their own 19 homes; moreover, minority homeownership set a record annual rate of 20 21 51 percent, which translated into more than 15.5 million minority 22 homeowners; and

23 WHEREAS, Alphonso Jackson witnessed firsthand the struggles 24 of urban Americans, growing up the youngest in a family of 12

1 children in Dallas; later, he set out to help other families in need 2 when he served as president and chief executive officer of the 3 Housing Authority of the City of Dallas; during his tenure there 4 from 1989 to 1996, that agency was consistently ranked as one of the 5 best-managed large city housing agencies in the country; he has 6 also worked as a senior administrator of housing agencies in St. 7 Louis and Washington, D.C., and is an experienced executive in both 8 the public and private sectors; immediately preceding his 9 appointment at HUD, Secretary Jackson served as president of 10 America Electric Power-TEXAS, a \$13 billion utility company located in Austin; and 11

12 WHEREAS, Secretary Jackson has shared his expertise on public 13 housing and urban issues with a number of state and national 14 entities, including the General Services Commission of the State of 15 Texas, which he served as chair; he has also served on the National 16 Commission of America's Urban Families, the National Commission on 17 Severely Distressed Public Housing, and numerous nonprofit and 18 corporate boards; and

WHEREAS, Described by President Bush as a man of great 19 integrity and compassion, Secretary Jackson has worked tirelessly 20 21 during his tenure as Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to facilitate the goal of home ownership for more Americans, 22 particularly minorities; a firm supporter of the belief that we 23 24 best serve our neighbors in need by empowering them to pursue their dreams, he has demonstrated a strong commitment to improving the 25 26 lives of all Americans and truly represents the very best in 27 government service; now, therefore, be it
