1-20 WHEREAS, The chefs who make contemporary variations on pan de 1-21 campo recognize that cowboy bread's appeal lies not only in its 1-22 elegant simplicity but also in its role as a redolent reminder of 1-23 the state's storied past and the vaqueros of South Texas; and

1-24 WHEREAS, Because the cowboys who introduced pan de campo to 1-25 Texas had no access to conventional kitchens, the bread was 1-26 prepared in small portable ovens, and it was this distinctive 1-27 cooking method that gave pan de campo its characteristic texture 1-28 and flavor; and

1-29 WHEREAS, Pan de campo enjoys a singular stature in Texas 1-30 history and culture that is rivaled only by its undeniable appeal as 1-31 a versatile and satisfying food, and it is only right and proper 1-32 that this essential element of the state's greatness receive 1-33 official recognition; now, therefore, be it
