- 7 Williams in 1938 and two years later, the couple moved to Paris,
- 8 where they raised their two children; and
- 9 WHEREAS, After receiving an associate's degree from the
- 10 College of Marshall, Mrs. Williams earned her bachelor's degree
- 11 from the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor and her master's degree
- 12 from East Texas State University; and
- WHEREAS, She enjoyed a career as an educator that spanned
- 14 nearly two decades, teaching English at East Texas State University
- and at Paris Junior College, where she also served as chair of the
- 16 English and communication department; and
- WHEREAS, Throughout her life, Mrs. Williams gave of her time
- and talents to a host of civic organizations; a former president of
- 19 the Cosmos Club, the Garden Club of Paris, the Garden Study Club,
- 20 and the McCuistion Regional Medical Center Auxiliary, she was also
- 21 a valued member of the Round Table Study Club, the Moderne Music
- 22 Club, and the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, to name but a
- 23 few; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In addition, Mrs. Williams was deeply interested in
- 25 history and volunteered with a host of preservation efforts,
