1 WHEREAS, J. E. "Gene" Buster, a former Lamar County 2 commissioner, passed away on May 22, 2004, at the age of 75, leaving 3 his loved ones many happy memories to cherish from his long and 4 productive life; and

5 WHEREAS, Born on October 5, 1928, in Woodstown, Oklahoma, Mr. 6 Buster graduated from Central High School in Sumner in 1946 and went 7 on to earn degrees from Southern Methodist University and Lamar 8 Business College; he served in the U.S. Army from 1948 to 1954, 9 during which time he married Kikue Mori in Tokyo, Japan; and

10 WHEREAS, A dairy farmer and rancher, he owned and operated 11 the Buster Dairy Farm from 1956 to 1970 and later operated the 12 Country Store at Emberson; throughout his life, he always made time 13 to work in behalf of his fellow citizens in a variety of civic 14 endeavors; and

15 WHEREAS, Mr. Buster was the Lamar County commissioner of 16 Precinct 3 from 1977 to 1988 and again from 1992 to 1996, and he was 17 recognized as a dedicated public servant by his peers in the 18 community; he enjoyed membership with the Lamar County Chamber of 19 Commerce, the Lamar County Democratic Party, and the Veterans of 20 Foreign Wars of the United States and Lamar County, and he also 21 served as president of the Mount Tabor Cemetery Association; and

22 WHEREAS, This esteemed gentleman was affiliated with Odd 23 Fellows, the Lions Club, the Red River Valley Fair Association, and 24 the Lamar Point Volunteer Fire Department; he was also active in the

Boy Scouts of America, 4-H, the Senior Citizen Board, and Sumner United Methodist Church, where he served as a trustee and as a member of the Methodist Men of North Lamar Parish; and

WHEREAS, A loving husband and a devoted father and grandfather, Gene Buster was that rare individual who put the needs of others above his own personal needs, and although he is dearly missed by his family and friends, his spirit lives on through his myriad contributions to his community and his fellow citizens; now, therefore, be it
