1 WHEREAS, The city of Sulphur Springs celebrated its 2 sesquicentennial in 2004; and

WHEREAS, Located in Hopkins County, Sulphur Springs was originally known as Bright Star, a popular camping place for workers moving goods west from Jefferson; in 1854, a post office was established, and the name of the town was later changed to Sulphur Springs to advertise the city's mineral springs and their healing properties; and

WHEREAS, In 1872, the arrival of the railroad opened the area for travel and trade, and the cotton industry became central to the city's economic prosperity; the community also benefited from its exceptional fruit exports and the rich deposits of oil and gas that were discovered throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, Today, with more than 14,000 residents, Sulphur Springs is a thriving county seat, attracting tourists and visitors with the Hopkins County Museum and Heritage Park, which contains a number of historic houses, and the Music Box Gallery; and

WHEREAS, With its vibrant sense of community and history, the city of Sulphur Springs is a treasured asset of the Lone Star State, and it is a pleasure to pay tribute to this special Texas town and its forward-looking citizens; now, therefore, be it
