A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment establishing a moratorium in
- 2 death penalty cases in which analyses performed by a crime
- 3 laboratory operated by the City of Houston Police Department were
- 4 admitted into evidence.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 11, Article IV, Texas Constitution, is 7 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 8 (c) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a
- 9 person convicted of a capital offense and sentenced to death may not
- 10 be executed if at the trial of the offense evidence was admitted
- 11 that was analyzed by a forensic laboratory operated by the City of
- 12 Houston Police Department. The 80th Legislature or a subsequent
- 13 <u>legislature may enact a statute that ends the moratorium on</u>
- 14 executions established by this subsection.
- 15 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- submitted to the voters at an election to be held on November 8,
- 17 2005. The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against
- 18 the proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing that a
- 19 moratorium be established barring executions in certain death
- 20 penalty cases involving evidence analyzed by a City of Houston
- 21 Police Department laboratory."
