A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature
- 2 to permit an elderly or disabled person who owns property
- 3 designated as a homestead to transfer the ownership of the property
- 4 and the benefits and protections that result from that designation.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Article XVI, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 7 adding Section 53 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 53. (a) In this section, "disabled" means under a
- 9 disability for purposes of payment of disability insurance benefits
- 10 under Federal Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance or its
- 11 successor.
- 12 (b) The legislature by general law may authorize a person
- who is disabled or 65 years of age or older and who owns property
- designated as that person's homestead to transfer to another person
- by gift, sale, or otherwise the ownership of the property and any
- 16 property tax benefits or other protections that the property
- 17 receives as a result of being designated as that person's
- 18 homestead. Transferred property may retain the property tax
- 19 benefits and protections resulting from its designation as the
- 20 <u>homestead</u> of the transferor only as long as the transferor
- 21 continues to occupy the property as the transferor's principal
- 22 residence. The legislature by general law may provide eligibility
- 23 limitations under this section.
- 24 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be

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- 1 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2005.
- 2 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 3 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the
- 4 legislature to permit an elderly or disabled person who owns
- 5 property designated as a homestead to transfer the ownership of the
- 6 property and the benefits and protections that result from that
- 7 designation."
