RESOLUTION

- BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of
- 2 Texas, That, in accordance with Section 9(b), Article III, Texas
- 3 Constitution, the House of Representatives of the 79th Legislature
- 4 shall elect a speaker of the house from its own membership as
- 5 follows:
- 6 SECTION 1. NOMINATIONS. (a) The secretary of state shall
- 7 call for nominations from the floor for the election of speaker of
- 8 the house of representatives and shall recognize every member who
- 9 desires to make a nomination.
- 10 (b) Each member recognized for this purpose shall
- immediately advance to the front microphone and make the nomination
- in a nominating speech not to exceed five minutes in length.
- 13 (c) After all nominations have been made, the secretary of
- 14 state shall declare nominations to be closed.
- 15 SECTION 2. SECONDS. (a) A person is not considered a
- 16 nominee unless the nomination is seconded by at least one member.
- 17 (b) One seconding speech shall be allowed for each
- 18 nomination in the order in which nominations were made, then other
- 19 seconding speeches shall be allowed in rotation in the same order.
- 20 (c) No more than five seconding speeches shall be allowed
- 21 for each nominee.
- 22 (d) A seconding speech may not exceed three minutes in
- 23 length.
- SECTION 3. VOTING. All votes taken shall be record votes

- 1 entered in the House Journal.
- 2 SECTION 4. RESULTS; RUNOFF. (a) The secretary of state
- 3 shall announce the results of the election. If a nominee has
- 4 received a majority of the votes cast, the secretary of state shall
- 5 declare that nominee to be elected to the office of speaker of the
- 6 house of representatives.
- 7 (b) If no nominee has received a majority of the votes cast,
- 8 the two nominees receiving the largest number of votes in the first
- 9 ballot shall be in a runoff election conducted in accordance with
- 10 the voting procedures for the first ballot. The secretary of state
- 11 shall announce the results of the runoff election and declare the
- 12 nominee receiving the higher vote to be elected.
- 13 SECTION 5. OATH. After the election, the secretary of
- 14 state shall direct the administration of the oath of office to the
- 15 speaker-elect. The speaker shall take the chair immediately after
- 16 taking the oath of office.
