RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Section 5(b), Article III, Texas Constitution, 2 reads:

3 "When convened in regular Session, the first thirty days shall be devoted to the introduction of bills and thereof 4 5 resolutions, acting upon emergency appropriations, passing upon 6 the confirmation of the recess appointees of the Governor and such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in special 7 messages to the Legislature. During the succeeding thirty days of 8 the regular session of the Legislature the various committees of 9 each House shall hold hearings to consider all bills and 10 resolutions and other matters then pending; and such emergency 11 12 matters as may be submitted by the Governor. During the remainder 13 of the session the Legislature shall act upon such bills and 14 resolutions as may be then pending and upon such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in special messages to the 15 Legislature."; and 16

WHEREAS, It is specifically provided in Section 5(c), Article
III, Texas Constitution, that either house may otherwise determine
its order of business by an affirmative vote of four-fifths of its
membership; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas Legislature, by an affirmative vote of four-fifths of its membership, That the order of its business for the regular session is hereby determined to be otherwise than set forth in Section 5(b),
