RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Robert D. Price, former U.S. 2 congressman and Texas state senator, passed away on August 24, 3 2004, at the age of 76, leaving a void in the lives of his many 4 admirers; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of Reading, Kansas, Bob Price was born in 6 1927 and attended Oklahoma State University; he graduated in 1951 7 and married the former Martha "Marty" White that same year; and

8 WHEREAS, This patriotic American served his country as a U.S. 9 Air Force fighter pilot during the Korean War; he flew 27 combat 10 missions and was awarded an Air Medal for his courageous service; 11 and

12 WHEREAS, For most of his life, Congressman Price lived in 13 Pampa, where he farmed and ranched for 50 years; his Panhandle ranch 14 spanned four counties and had been in the Price family since 1907; 15 and

16 WHEREAS, It was in the 1960s that he first displayed an 17 interest in politics, campaigning for a seat in the U.S. House of 18 Representatives; a pioneering member of the Republican Party, he 19 was elected to the house in 1966 and served until 1974; while in 20 office, he served on the House Agriculture Committee and sat on the 21 Manned Space Flight and NASA Oversight Subcommittees; and

22 WHEREAS, Congressman Price won a special election to fill a 23 vacancy in the Texas Senate in 1977, campaigning with the slogan, 24 "Price is right for Texas"; returning to his ranching and farming

operation full-time in 1980, he continued to maintain an interest in politics and remained a popular figure in the Republican Party throughout his life; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Price was a longtime member of the First
Baptist Church and Pampa Masonic Lodge No. 966 A.F. & A.M.; a former
member of the Downtown Kiwanis Club, he also held membership in the
El Paso Scottish Rite Consistory, Khiva Shrine Temple of Amarillo,
and the Pampa Shrine Club; and

9 WHEREAS, Recognized for his sense of humor, strength of 10 conviction, and dedication to public service, Bob Price sought to 11 make a positive difference in the lives of others, and he leaves 12 behind a legacy of achievement that will surely inspire those who 13 will follow in his footsteps; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 79th Texas Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of the Honorable Robert D. Price and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his family: to his wife, Marty Price; to his son, Carl Price; to his daughter, Janice Johnson; to his brother, Ben Price, Jr.; and to the many other relatives and friends of this esteemed gentleman; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Robert D. Price.
